The general review was that the boards were very well constructed, ran smooth and much quieter then the old boards and that the bases ran straight “out of the box”.





Congratulations to Norbert Revels on his win in the Championship game, to Karim Campbell for making it to the Championship game and to all the coaches who participated in this tournament.

# Pregame jitters

Fans of a classic game rule miniature playing fields at an Electric Football convention.

Home life got easier in America in the 1940s, when factories churned out mountains of gadgets to smooth the Greatest Generation's task of bringing up the Baby Boom.

While parents dreamed of color TVs and eye level ovens, a lot of their kids apparently burned to coach pro football teams. Technology had an answer for that.

In the late-1940s, a metal products company owner named Norman Sas invented one of the most durable fulfillments of fantasy known to postwar America. Sas discovered if he vibrated a sheet of metal, tiny cars placed on top of it would move around by themselves. Pretty soon, he was putting Lilliputian quarterbacks and linebackers on a little metal field that buzzed and jiggled.

"It was kind of serendipity," says Doug Strohm, president of Tudor Games, Sas' former company. It also was the stuff of sports-fan heaven.

"You line up your little players across from each other, and you let it fly. The play develops the way it does in real life. Someone trips and falls, someone goes in a direction you don't expect," says Strohm.

Kids became obsessed with the game, spending hours devising plays for little plastic teams. Among them was Corey Johnson of Philadelphia, whose cousin owned an Electric Football game.

"He flipped the switch, and the men moved by themselves," recalls Johnson. "I was floored." It became a favorite pastime for him, right up to the late-1980s when Johnson, like millions of other fans, discovered football video games.

Fittingly for a toy Strohm says sold more units than the Easy Bake Oven or even Lincoln Logs, the retro charm of Electric Football never really died out. One day, Johnson got a newsletter from a toy company singing the praises of the old-school toy.

The former childhood player was back in the game. He traveled around the country to conventions, where adherents battled it out

in tournaments. He rose through the ranks to become commissioner of the Philly National Electric Football League, which Strohm calls "the largest and most-established Electric Football league in the United States."

That would be the owner-coaches of 32 fantasy pro teams who play regularly at two venues in Northeast Philadelphia. "It's like our version of a women's book club," says Johnson. "We have some guys smoking cigars, drinking wine. It's a big guy-hangout thing."

The league is fully populated with coaches, but "we always have five guys looking to get in," he says.

There will be lots more room Saturday and Sunday when Strohm brings TudorCON14, the Super Bowl of Electric Football, to the Embassy Suites Philadelphia Airport Hotel at 9000 Bartram Ave. The free event includes exhibits, tournaments and a world championship game Sunday morning.

Johnson, whose Philly league includes members from as far away as Detroit, expects a healthy turnout. So though he is an Electric Football Hall of Famer, he likely will spend the weekend explaining the game to walk-in visitors. The convention starts at 9 a.m. both days.

Strohm says Tudor Games will introduce a battery-operated remote-controlled version of Electric Football that has a new plastic playing surface. It's part of recruiting younger players for a pursuit that, in the end, has few age boundaries.

"If you really want to swing your own team, and you can't manage being a high school coach, this is the next-best thing," he says.

Johnson says it's appealing even if you are a sports coach, like several members of the Philly league. The teams meet regularly

**Re-launching electric football**

Johnson glad-handed his way Saturday through the hotel ballroom that hosted TudorCon14, the Electric Football World Championships and Convention. It wasn't just the 86 cheese steaks he had arranged for delivery from D'Alessandro's that made him popular. Johnson is one of the main reasons that Doug Strohm, the new owner of Tudor Games, chose Philadelphia as the venue for the event that he hopes re-launches the classic game to a new generation. Hundreds turned out for the three-day event at the Embassy Suites Airport Hotel. The double-elimination tournament, which wrapped up Sunday, had entries for 70 players.

Many of the mostly middle-aged men wandering the halls in football jerseys were a part of the 32-team league Johnson organizes in the Northeast, where he moved several years ago. Starting the week after the real Super Bowl, the men meet at Daly's Irish Pub just off Harbison Avenue for 16 straight weekends until they crown their own champion. The league, which includes players from as far away as Maryland, claims roots going back 19 years and has a waiting list to join. They play for a crystal trophy and bragging rights.

Johnson has traveled to conventions all over the country - hence his "National" moniker - but perhaps surprisingly, the competitive aspect has never been what's driven Johnson toward the game. As a kid - Johnson won't give his age except to say he's a baby boomer - he experimented with putting pennies or clay on the bases of players to make them run straighter, but gave it up quickly. Instead, he held a training camp for his players. The ones that didn't run to his liking were relegated to a shoe box. Johnson was more interested in using tape to create wristbands, or sprinkling baby powder over the board to create a snow game. "It made a mess after we were done, but it was cool," Johnson said.

The game play never drove Media's Earl Shores, either. He found his first board - featuring the Browns and the Giants - under his tree in 1968 as an 8-year-old. Last fall, he published a book he spent 12 years working on: *The Unforgettable Buzz: The History of Electric Football and Tudor*. Back in the '60s, the NFL was scarce on TV and apparel hard to come by. He was captivated by the chance to have the league in miniature on his kitchen table. Shores spent hours going through the catalog looking for teams to order. "You'd have the order form, and you'd check a team and you would erase it and check someone else because you couldn't make up your mind," Shores said. "It was a buck-fifty to send to Brooklyn and get your team, trying to scrape your pennies together."

Strohm, the president and CEO of Tudor Games, wants to bring that experience back. He grew up in rural Ohio with four sisters, developing his own games to keep him busy. He cashed in on a successful career in the software and marketing business to buy the Tudor brand two years ago. Strohm's innovations include the first remote control, invisible bases that allow for more precise game play, and an iPad app that serves as a playbook and scoreboard. He plans to have the new boards available in retail stores by the fall, and is working on regaining the NFL license. As a historian, Shores is on board. "It has to evolve to stay vital," Shores said. "And he's got the right idea."



Both Speed Cleats™ and Strength Cleats™ can be trimmed with safety scissors or nail clippers to make them run as you wish. On top, you can trim off the corner edges to move past other players, or leave them squared off for maximum blocking. Underneath, think of the Cleat as your canvas and trim away the material in the front and back that is touching the playing field. Generally, the less material touching the field, the faster your players will be. The more material touching the field, the stronger your players will be.

In this example, a Strength Cleat is trimmed with a pair of nail clippers to produce a faster hybrid Cleat.

Experiment with different trimming patterns on the front and back as shown in the examples on this page. Always be careful when trimming Cleats.






**IMPORTANT:** Try to keep the overall height of your Cleats the same. For example, cut the material down to points but don't reduce the overall height of the Cleat, or create a tilted Cleat. This is not legal in most leagues.




**CONTROL**  
The Speed Cleat is a thinner Strength Cleat. Two are required. To control a player's direction of travel, try angling one Cleat and then the other, then run them to see how they perform. See the Speed Cleat examples below.

**PERFORMANCE**  
The performance configurations below are useful to get the most out of each position. The **PUNCH** is used along the defensive line or at running back to bust through the pile. The **FOCUSED PUNCH** is good for receivers to break away from coverage. The **STICKY** is good for blockers to stay stuck to defenders. The **SPIN** is good for pocket passers and zone defenders because it keeps the player spinning in place. The **STABLE** is good for any player who needs to stay upright against a tough opponent.


