MEMPHIS PERFECT HOST FOR 2002 EFL CONVENTION

With the music of Elvis Presley and B.B. King resonating in the air...the taste of tangy barbecue on everyone's tongues...and the mighty Mississippi flowing just a few miles to the west...the real "buzz" in Memphis, TN, over the weekend of January 18-20, 2002, was the **8th Annual Official Electric Football Super Bowl & Convention**.

Hosted by the Memphis Marriott East Hotel, the Convention attracted visitors from at least 28 different states for a weekend of great competition, friendly rivalries, a bushelful of laughs, wonderful camaraderie and multi-generational fun.

RON BELL THREE-PEATS AS SUPER BOWL CHAMP

Ron Bell, an assistant district attorney from **New Orleans**, coached the Miami Dolphins to their third consecutive Electric Football Super Bowl title at the Memphis Marriott East hotel during the final day of the **8th Annual Official Electric Football Super Bowl & Convention** on Jan. 20, 2002.

The Dolphins defeated their in-state rivals, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, coached by **Mike Turner**, of **Las Vegas, NV**, 22-12, to earn the prestigious Miggle Cup. The highlights of the Super Bowl 8 of Electric Football included two touchdown passes by the Dolphins quarterback (Bell), a Miami kick-off return for a TD and two Dolphin two-point conversions. The "fish" defense held the Bucs to just two scores and no extra points.

"I wanted to win this one," said an enthusiastic Bell after his victory, "because it was more of a challenge to fight through the new League Champions bracket than to skip over everything via the videotape entry method as I had in the previous two years. "Mike Turner did a great job, but my Dolphins have just been in the trenches together

now for three years and showed up very focused and confident once again. It's the players that play the game, I'm just glad I've been along for the ride."

Competition in Memphis included Wild Card and League Champions tournaments leading to the AFC and NFC title games and the Super Bowl for adults; the Buzz Bowl for Women; and two Spark Bowls for Kids.

Fifteen-year-old **Elly Hargrave**, from **Nicholson, PA**, captured both the Buzz Bowl for Women, defeating two-time defending champion **Joyce Rogers** of **Akron, OH**, in the championship game; and the Spark Bowl for Kids Senior Division, beating **Martel Cooks**, 14, of **Detroit** in the title match.

The Spark Bowl for Kids Junior Division was captured by eight-year-old **Kyle Nutt** of **Moore, SC**, in a tight game over **Derek Faile**, age 10, of **Rock Hill, SC**. Shortly after his victory, Kyle, along with dad Brian, were featured in a multi-page story, complete with color photos, in their

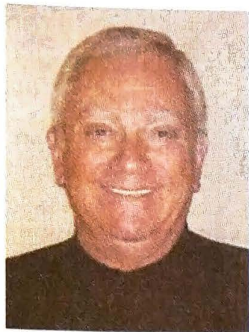

PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

For the second consecutive year, the Miggle Toys' Electric Football "Player of the Year" Award went to a pair of deserving coaches. For 2000, it was **Bill and Mark Klingbeil**—and the Award for 2001 was won by **Steve Graham and David Nickles** of the **Oxford Electric Football Club** in Alabama.

The announcement was made at the 2002 EFL Convention by Commissioner Michael Landsman.

Graham, 37, lives in **Lincoln, AL** and is a Warehouse Manager for International Paper. He began playing Electric Football at the age of 10. "I was hooked on Electric Football the first time I played it and now, 27 years later, I'm still playing it," he stated. Graham joined the Oxford EFC in 1980, and says that for years he and his fellow coaches thought they were the only ones still

playing the game—until they attended a Miggle Convention in Chicago in the mid-1990s and ran into hundreds of other EFL devotees from all over the country.

Nickles, 47, resides in **Oxford** and works as a forklift operator for New South Express. He began playing Electric Football when he was 11 years old with his brothers, joined an EFL league in Fort Payne, AL, a while later, then founded the Oxford EFC in 1979. He won the league title in 2001, defeating Graham in the championship game.

In 2001, the dynamic duo—in addition to finishing 1-2 in their EFL league—helped initiate a youth-oriented program in their local area in which league members donated Electric Football game boards and teams to a local community center to help get kids off the street and encourage them to be involved in a fun and safe hobby. 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GETTING CONNECTED WITH... BRANDI CHASTAIN

Brandi Chastain is recognized as one of the most talented, successful and popular soccer players in the world. In just the past three years, she has kicked the winning goal in sudden death to lead the U.S. to its first-ever Women's World Cup title (1999), was an integral member of the U.S. Women's Soccer Team that captured the Gold Medal at the 2000 Olympics in Australia and was the driving force behind the Bay Area CyberRays securing



the inaugural WUSA championship (2001).

Off the field, Brandi is just as busy. In between practice, training and traveling the globe on behalf of her sport, she also finds considerable time to make special appearances for charities and the companies she represents.

Brandi, who was initially drawn to soccer because of the game's team focus, the solidarity it

engenders both on and off the field and the great fun she has playing it, was first introduced to Electric Football at a young age. Recently she had a cross-country phone conversation with **PLUGGED IN!** in which she talked about her life-long fondness for Electric Football. Here are the highlights of that discussion:

PLUGGED IN!: When and how did you first start playing Electric Football?

Brandi Chastain: "I was eight years old. Every Sunday my dad, Roger, would have his friends from the neighborhood over to our house to watch football on TV and play Electric Football. What I remember most about those days was how much fun the men had playing Electric Football, and how much laughter there was in the house. I just kinda stuck my nose into what they were doing, and they let me play with them."

PI!: What else do you remember about that time?

BC: "Ultimately, the fondest memory I have is how much fun we had playing the game, as well as how competitive my dad and the other men from the neighborhood were. I always enjoyed playing defense back then, having my players make the tackles and being the defensive stopper. (Writer's Note: These are the roles Brandi plays today on the soccer field.) I also liked the randomness of the game—you never knew what would happen from play to play, where the players would go, things like that. And that's what's so much fun about playing soccer—you just don't know what's going to happen on the field from game to game. That's why we play."

PI!: How long did you continue playing the game?

BC: "I guess I played into my early teens. At that time—in the late '70s and early '80s—it was very fashionable and popular where I lived in San Jose, CA, to play Electric Football."

PI!: Who else did you play with back then?

BC: "I also played Electric Football with the boys in the neighborhood. They would come over to our house since we were the ones with the board and the players. Unfortunately, back then there weren't any other girls who played with us."

PI!: What "lessons" did you learn from playing Electric Football?

BC: "What I learned the most was the concept of 'team' and being a good sport. It also taught me how to set up the offense and defense. Since we played a lot of Electric Football while our TV was tuned to pro games, it was a learning experience for me going back and forth between real football on the television and Electric Football right in front of me. It was great!"

PI!: How do you think a "retro" game like Electric Football fits into the high-tech world of toys and games in the 21st Century?

BC: "Even though everyone talks about how sophisticated and technologically advanced things are today, I definitely think there is something to be said about things back when I was a kid. It was fun to be able to play a hands-on game like Electric Football. It was social, it was competitive and most of all—it was FUN!"

PI!: One final question: When was the last time you played Electric Football?

BC: "Believe it or not, it was yesterday. I played with some of my teammates. I call them the 'new wave of football fans'—women. They loved it because it was fun and they are very competitive. I think we've found our solution for dealing with the stress and tension of travel, training, staying healthy and trying to win that comes with being a professional soccer player." ■

JOHN OUBRE OF NOEFL NAMED 2001 NEWCOMER OF THE YEAR

Following in the tradition of such exemplary past winners as Joyce Rogers, Ron Bell and Elly Hargrave, the 2001 EFL "Newcomer of the Year"—**John Oubre of Baton Rouge, LA**—exhibited a truly admirable combination of skill, exuberance, commitment and unselfishness last year.

Oubre, a 45-year-old photographer who works in the Southern University Publications Office, is relatively new to Electric Football. Having never played the game as a child, he first picked it up in 1997, and began competing in the tough Dallas/Ft. Worth EFL by 1999. That was a real commitment for Oubre, as it is a seven hour drive each way between Baton Rouge and those Texas cities.

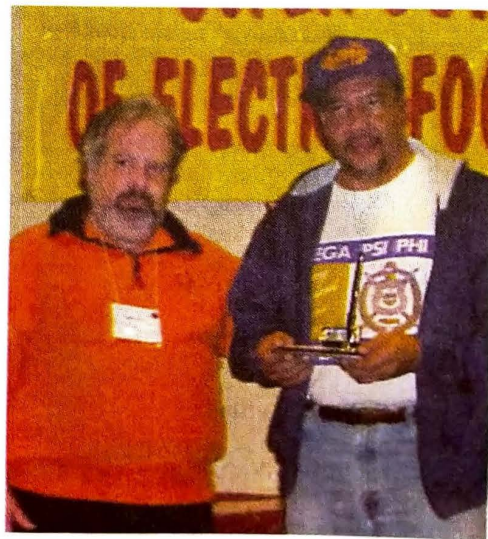
Oubre joined the equally strong New Orleans EFL in 2000—and actually qualified for the Bayou Bowl playoffs in his rookie year in the league. This past season, he competed in both leagues, another challenge as they both utilize different styles of play. But that didn't deter Oubre from his

growth as an EFL coach—he made the semi-finals in the 2001 New Orleans post-season tournament, and qualified for the playoffs in the DFW League as a Wildcard.

"I was very, very surprised when I won the 2001 Newcomer of the Year Award," recalled Oubre in a conversation with **PLUGGED IN!** two weeks after the Convention. "It was hard for me to make a speech right after hearing my name called—but now I would really like to thank everyone associated with Miggle Toys, all of my fellow coaches in the New Orleans EFL and my family for being so supportive of our hobby and of me."

The Memphis EFL Convention was the first for Oubre, but he promises it won't be his last. A dedicated family man, Oubre and his wife, Carla, have three children: Chrisdelin (25), Christopher (18) and Chad (14), the newest member of the NOEFL.

YOU'RE NOT ALONE IF YOU PLAY SOLITAIRE EFL

As EFL leagues continue to sprout up all over the country, and existing leagues constantly add more coaches to their ranks, the game of Solitaire Electric Football still remains strong among enthusiastic EFLers.

Solitaire play probably began the day after the first Electric Football game was purchased back in 1947. While designed to be a competitive and social activity between two or more "coaches," Electric Football aficionados quickly discovered that the game also lent itself to single play, as well. Utilizing various "rules," strategies and rationales, these serious Electric Football fans often play out entire NFL or college seasons in their basements, on their dining room table or in their dens, frequently not aware that countless other EFLers were doing exactly the same thing.

Recently, Miggle Toys' public relations representative Ira H. Silverman posted a request on the company's Chatboard asking Solitaire EFL Coaches to share their stories with other Electric Football fans. E-mails quickly came rushing into Silverman's cyber mailbox, and here are some of our favorite stories:

• **Chris Stacey of Hampton, VA**, got this Solitaire story rolling with a posting on the Chatboard in early Feb. '02. He plays the entire NFL schedule as the CSSL (Chris Stacey Solitaire League), owning all 31 teams in both home and away uniforms. He's even painted both versions of the new Houston Texans, so he will be ready for the kick-off of 2002 season in September. At 46 years of age, Chris has been playing Solitaire

• **Kurt "Doc" Smeby**, an American who has been coaching American Football in Europe for almost two decades, is another avid Solitaire EFLer. An Electric Football enthusiast since he was 12, Doc always plays the offense in Solitaire, setting up standard defenses according to the yardage situations. He feels that if you play purely offense for both sides, and only logical defenses, it is pretty fair. "Electric Football was vital to my drive, commitment and interest in the game of football in the first place," Doc states, "While other boys stopped playing, I kept playing and collecting. I credit Tudor Games, and now Miggle Toys, for keeping me confident and able to read coverages, gaps and mismatches." 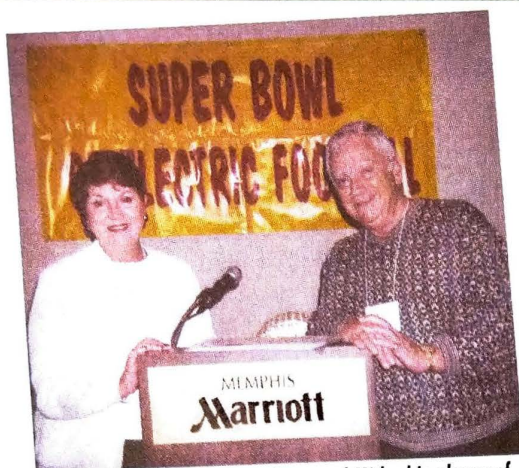
• **Jim Jackson of Portage, MI**, has been an ardent Electric Football player since his youth, enjoying both Solitaire and head-to-head competition. In Solitaire, he builds his teams based on NFL players' likenesses, speed, etc. All teams are even in his style of play, and he even has flag-throwing referees so that "anything" can happen, which makes each game different. "I like Solitaire because it creates game-like situations," Jim says, "so when I play another coach, my coaching is good. My wife lost her battle with cancer recently, and I will be playing my upcoming Solitaire season

• **Mike Mardeusz of Livonia, MI**, began playing solitaire between the ages of 13 and 18, and then re-discovered the game after he found it in his mom's basement about 12 years ago. Now 36 years of age, the coffee service manager started by replaying classic Super Bowl match-ups, and then moved on to playing the NFL schedule. 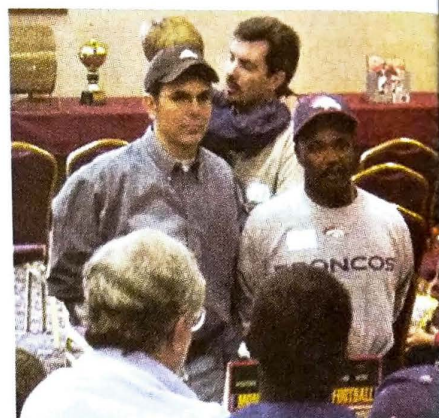

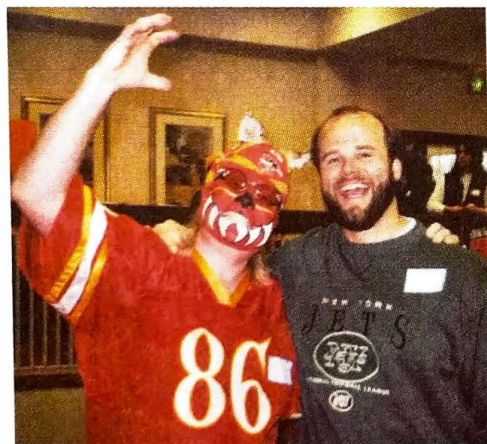

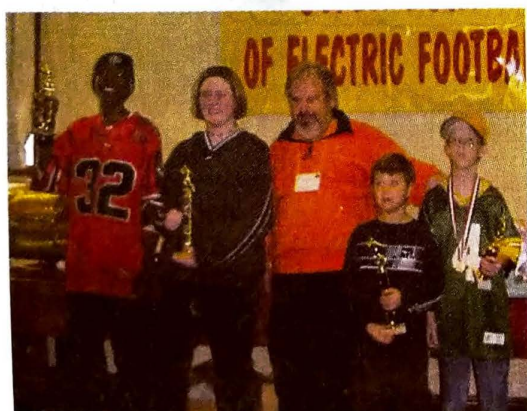

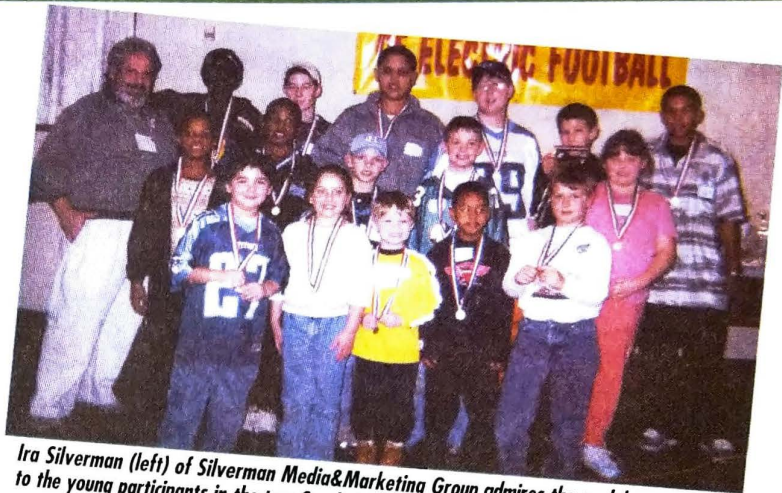

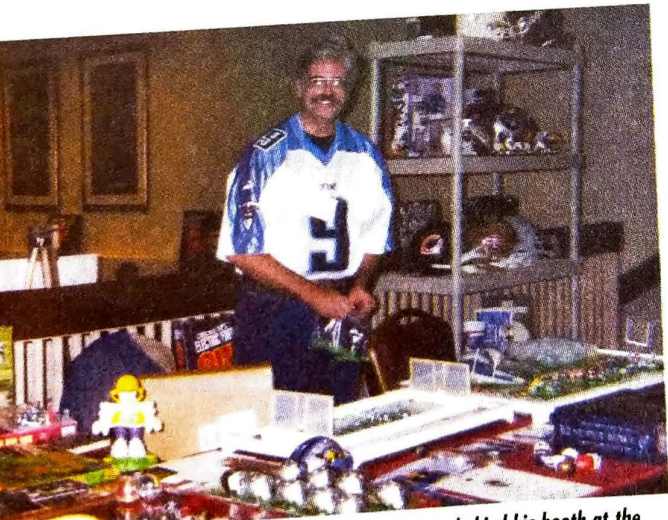

Spotlight On: LOS ANGELES EFL

Although it has been around for less than three years, the Los Angeles EFL has quickly become one of the most exciting, competitive and promotion-minded EFL leagues in the country. And by drawing Coaches from such large distances as San Diego and Las Vegas, the LAEFL also covers more American turf than almost any other EFL league.

What also sets the LAEFL apart is the fact that it is the only "pro football league in town" since the NFL abandoned the area several years ago. But Electric Football is alive and doing very well in Southern California, thanks especially to the LAEFL's co-commissioners, **Eric Robinson** and **David Campbell**. PLUGGED IN! spoke with both Robinson and Campbell recently to get a little insight into the elements behind their success.

The commissioners explained that the Los Angeles Electric Football League was founded in the Fall of 2000 by **Chet Haptonstal**, **Vince Peatros** and **Al Clegg**. In their first season, games were held in **Thousand Oaks, CA**, in Haptonstal's garage. "You have to start some place, right?" remarked Robinson. Since then, beginning with their second season, league games have been held on weekends in the community room at the Westfield Shopping Town (formerly Foxhills Mall) located in **Culver City, CA**.

"Our 'home stadium' is totally windowed, so everyone going shopping on those days can look in and watch us in action," Campbell stated. "There seems to be a 'buzz' going through the entire mall. Dozens and dozens of people stop in to watch us play each time we're there. They ask lots of questions and try the game themselves. We especially get a lot of dads who played the game as kids who come in with their sons and daughters to show them Electric Football. It's a real blast for everyone."

The Coaches of the Los Angeles EFL

The LAEFL started with eight coaches, two of whom drove regularly to LA from Las Vegas. During their second season, the number doubled to 16, with Vegas having enough coaches to field its own division. For the league's third season, 24 coaches have signed on, and they will be divided into four six-team divisions, three in the Greater LA Area and one in Vegas.

To enhance their EFL league play, the LAEFL has added "The Box," which involves rolling dice to simulate in their Electric Football games some of the uncontrollable entities of real football. Explained Campbell: "Combinations of dice rolls result in fumbles, penalties, and injuries, which are all unplanned, uncontrollable things that impact a football game very much—and which oftentimes play a major role in deciding which team wins. Because these things mostly happen by chance in real football, we feel that The Box is an excellent way to simulate them in our EFL play."

What also seems to set the LAEFL apart from other EFL leagues is the composition of their Coaches roster. "We have a wide range of Coaches," Robinson noted, "that includes three artists, two recorded musicians, an apparel manufacturer, two

pastors, a biotech expert, a telecommunications manager and one woman. Two of our coaches drive up to Los Angeles from San Diego for our monthly game days. Although some basic belief systems may vary, everyone gets along when it comes to Electric Football—it is all about FUN and RESPECT!"
