A NEW GENERATION DISCOVERS ELECTRIC FOOTBALL

After 56 years as America's all-time favorite tabletop football game, Electric Football keeps getting younger. Or at least hundreds of "Coaches" seem to be getting more youthful.

A look around the 2003 Official Electric Football Convention—as well as a survey of EFL leagues, clinic programs and individual Coaches—demonstrates that the fun, challenge, friendliness and competitiveness of the game that has lasted for decades has now enthralled a whole new generation of young people all over the country.

"It was just amazing to see the interest and quality of play of the children at our Miggle Toys Convention this past January," noted EFL Commissioner **Michael Landsman**. "We had dozens of boys and girls between the ages of seven and 15 playing in our two Spark Bowl tournaments—and even younger ones participating in our free clinics. The future of Electric Football is bright—

and it looks to be in the hands—and fingers—of our children."

Do the same things that attract older men and women to the game draw youths and teenagers to the vibrating gridiron? PLUGGED IN! asked some kids and parents that question, and here's what they said:

"I like Electric Football because there is no pushing or shoving and you can have fun and really think about your next move," stated eight year old **Shyenne Davis** of Detroit, who won the Junior Division of the 2003 Spark Bowl Tournament this January, only one month after taking up the game. "It was really cool to win the Spark Bowl—I am going to teach my daddy (EFL vet **Jim Davis**) a few tricks now."

The winner of the Senior Spark Bowl tournament, 14-year-old **D.C. Smith** of Portsmouth, VA, commented: "I have been enjoying Electric

Football for two years. The game teaches people how to develop football strategies, sportsmanship and helps you make new friends. It also shows me how to have fun doing something other than video games."

Kathy was a force at Miggle Toys for more than 30 years, keeping the warehouse running smoothly and trying her best to keep every customer

BEST WISHES TO OUR TROOPS

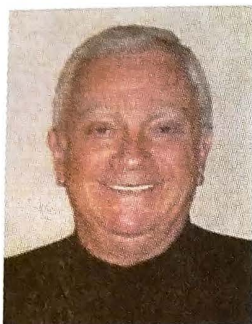

For some people, the *Annual Official Electric Football Super Bowl & Convention*, held every January, is the culminating event of their football season. But to others, this special weekend serves as the kick-off of a new Electric Football year for them.

To our mind, both camps are correct.

Electric Football has become one of America's few year-round sports.

This year's Convention proved that the level of play and interest in our game increased greatly in the previous 12 months. Tournament games among both adults and youngsters were close, competitive and exciting. The NFC and AFC Wild Card divisions drew dozens of Coaches with an assortment of different playing styles, all of whom had to lead teams comprised of Miggle Toys-issued figures and bases. And the League Champions competitions, which for the first time utilized EFL college teams, attracted the top players from all over the U.S. who also were required to use Miggle-distributed equipment.

The Convention was the site for the announcement of our 2002 Player of the Year—**Aaron Johnson** of Columbus, OH; and our 2002 Newcomer of the Year—**Rob Delmasse** of Edgewood, PA. Both Aaron and Rob did remarkable jobs in helping to promote and publicize our game to as wide of an audience as possible last year, and we look forward to their continued contributions in the future.

The weekend hit its highest note when the

University of Oklahoma Sooners, coached by **Edgar Downs** of Gary, IN, gained three yards on the last play of overtime to defeat the Seattle Seahawks, led by Coach **Charles Vaughn** of Harrisburg, PA, 15-14, in the first-ever overtime EFL Super Bowl game. It was a match-up for the ages—and who could ever forget Coach Downs' emotional joy when he received the Miggle Trophy in the post-game awards ceremony.

But to many other Coaches who witnessed the final play of the 2003 EFL Super Bowl, it served not as the end of something—but rather as an inspiration and launching pad for their 2003 Electric Football play.

Yes, our game is now played 12 months a year by most Coaches, whether it be in league competition, in a solitaire format or informally with family and friends. While the game is fun and amusing, Coaches frequently inform us that they also enjoy Electric Football because of "the mental challenge it presents" or because "it relieves stress and tension after work" or because "the game provides an opportunity for our entire family to get together and do an activity we *all* enjoy."

Those sound like worthwhile reasons to regularly play a game that is 56 years old—and getting younger every year!

I'm sure I speak for everyone when I say how inspirational it was to see the coaching talent that was demonstrated by the nearly three dozen boys and girls who entered our two Spark Bowl tourneys this year. Their knowledge of both the sport of football and the game of Electric Football was remarkable, as was their sportsmanship, enthusiasm and insight for the game. All I can say is "The future of Electric Football is in good hands."

I want to wish everyone great beginnings of their Electric Football "seasons" regardless of when those seasons begin and end.

AARON JOHNSON 2002 EFL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

In selecting **Aaron Johnson** of Columbus, OH, who has been playing Electric Football for the past 27 years, as the **2002 EFL Player of the Year**, the Miggle Toys Selection Committee clearly made a very inspired and popular decision.

PLUGGED IN! recently had a chance to discuss his Award and other topics with Aaron, who is a medical biller. Here are highlights of that interview:

PLUGGED IN!: What made 2002 so special for you?

Aaron Johnson: 2002 was a very busy and exciting year for me. It started off with the Miggle Convention, where I represented my league in the Champions Bracket. In April, members of our league teamed with the Pittsburgh EFL to present Electric Football at the Steelers' Fan Blitz. Later in the year, I was featured on our local FOX-TV station, where they shot footage of my Ohio State Buckeyes scoring against DeWayne Jennings' Miami Hurricanes in a pre-National Championship Game scrimmage. There were lots more things, but those were the highlights.

PI!: What was your reaction when you heard your name called as the 2002 EFL Player of the Year?

AJ: I sort of froze because it sounded like the whole room got quiet and all eyes were on me. I was really shocked because there are so many great coaches doing great things in the hobby. It was a dream come true. The last football award that I received was in high school when I was given the Coaches Award. The EFL Player of the Year Award ranks up there with that Award.

PI!: What other hobbies do you have?

AJ: Although I plan on making screenwriting a career, it is now a hobby that I picked up two years ago. I also bowl in a league.

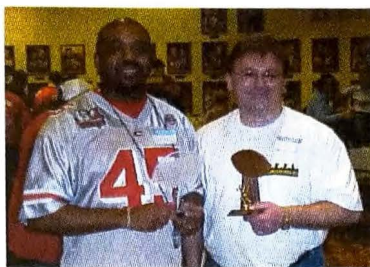
PI!: Tell us about your family.

AJ: My wife, Donielle, and I have two children, with a third on the way. There's our son, Aaron, who is 15, Ashley, nine, and a baby girl due in July.

PI!: What are your final thoughts on the Award?

ROB DELMASSE 2002 NEWCOMER OF THE YEAR

Prior to announcing the name of the **2002 EFL Newcomer of the Year Award** recipient at the Miggle Toys Electric Football Convention this past January, spokesperson **Ira H. Silverman** described the accomplishments that the Selection Committee used to choose the winner: a Coach who had a "breakthrough year" in terms of league or individual play; someone who had raised the level of his contributions to the growth of the game from the local level to the regional and/or national plateau; and an individual whose unselfishness and dedication to the game was recognized and appreciated by his peers.

The vote of the Selection Committee was unanimous: **Rob**

Delmasse of Pittsburgh, PA.

Rob, a chemistry lab technician at Carnegie Mellon University, has been playing Electric Football for more than 30 years—and helped to establish the Pittsburgh EFL in 1997. His wife **Bonnie** accompanied Rob to the Miggle Toys Convention this year, and was a supportive and excited "teammate."

"Rob embodies every element of a true EFL Newcomer of the Year Award Winner," stated EFL Commissioner **Michael Landsman**. "His involvement and contributions to the success of his hometown Pittsburgh Steelers' Electric Football promotions last year were totally awesome. We look for more great things from Rob in the future."

Rob recently spoke with **PLUGGED IN!** about his breakthrough year. Here are the high points of his past year:

PI!: Tell us a little bit about your 2002 Electric Football year.

RD: In April, the Pittsburgh EFL conducted an Electric Football Tournament for the Steelers at their Fan Blitz right in Heinz Stadium. In June, we were invited back to Heinz Field to hold an EF tournament for a private party—mostly kids. It was quite a show! The following month, my buddies in the PEFL and Bill and Mark Klingbeil assisted the Steelers in the taping of "Great Moments In Electric Football" vignettes. We taped 10 plays to be used as promotions during the team's 2002 season, with each play showcasing the Steelers doing something incredible against their opponent for that day. The pieces were shown on the Heinz Field Jumbotron during the two minute warning of every home game. Then in August, the Steelers invited the PEFL, the Klingbeils and DeWayne Jennings and Aaron Johnson from the Columbus (OH) EFL to the team's pre-season game vs. the NY Jets game to see the first "Great Moments" on the Jumbotron. What a night! The rest of the year went along just like that.

PI!: What other hobbies do you have?

RD: Both Bonnie and I are artists. I have a small collection of celebrity portraits I've done that we've had the individuals autograph. It's quite exciting.

PI!: What are your final thoughts on the Award, the Convention and the game of Electric Football?

RD: I have learned over the past year that Electric Football is a staple of American history and the history of entertainment games. There are so many positive levels to the interest, enjoyment and camaraderie this game has to offer. As I've said many times: It's been a great year!

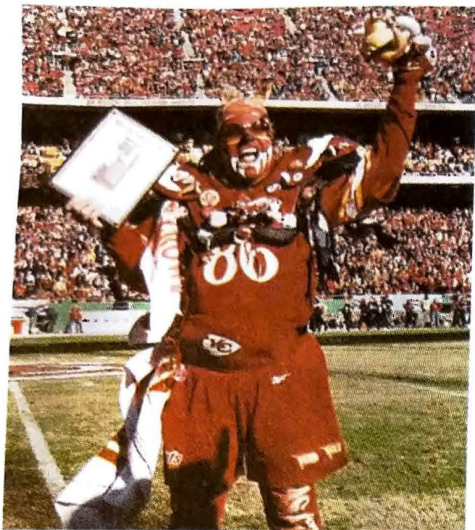
Seventeen hours of footage later, they more than succeeded with their ambitious endeavor!

You may have met him at a Miggle Toys EFL Convention. Perhaps you've seen his name and comments on the Miggle Chatboard. And, you may very well have heard or read about his exploits as a rabid Kansas City Chiefs' fan. And if you ever saw him dressed up and made up in full team regalia, you surely would never have forgotten him.

The man's name is **Lynn Schmidt**—but most of us know him as **"Weirdwolf,"** the guy in the red team uniform, war paint and other accessories enthusiastically cheering for his hometown heroes. Now even the Chiefs and the NFL recognize Schmidt for the dedicated, intense and 'over-the-top' fan he is.

Schmidt, a graphic designer from the Kansas City suburb of Parkville, MO, has been a fierce

Chiefs admirer since 1971. Of course, he does not consider himself to be just your "average" fan—and neither did the team when they chose him to be their **2002 Fan of the Year**. He was honored on the field during half-time of the Chiefs-Buffalo Bills game last Nov. 17, and will be feted again at the Pro Football Hall of Fame—along with super-fans from all of the other NFL teams—during the 2003 Induction Weekend this August.

Weirdwolf considers himself to be the keeper of the "WOLFPACK Tradition, which started back in Municipal Stadium when all of the NFL feared the Chiefs. He dresses in his Wolf pads, Wolf War paint and throws on his Wolf claws for each home game three hours before it starts, then roams around the parking lots of Arrowhead stadium rousing the Chiefs Fans. Schmidt has watched *every* Chiefs game since 1971, and has attended *every* game since moving to the K.C. area in 1998.

So just how do you become an NFL teams' Number One fan? In Weirdwolf's case, it was a wild assortment of activities and accomplishments, ranging from appearing "in costume" at dozens of team-related benefit functions, being quoted in numerous newspapers, being interviewed and seen on countless TV shows to being featured in the 2001 Chiefs Video Yearbook and in an NFL Films' Chiefs' highlights video. And the list goes on and on.

Another notable accomplishment in Schmidt's life occurred in August 2000, when he helped launch the **Great Plains Electric Football League (GPEFL)**, which included Coaches residing in the

metropolitan areas of Des Moines (IA), Kansas City (MO & KS) and Omaha (NE). Of equal significance is the fact that Schmidt has melded his love of Electric Football with his passion for the Chiefs, as evidenced by the autographs he has of Chiefs players on the tiny bases of his plastic EFL players. Further, he has reproduced the entire 1969, 1993 and 2002 Chiefs teams into EFL figures—down to the smallest details—which he uses during GPEFL competitions.

Introducing Electric Football to youngsters, and encouraging their continued participation in the game, is another special part of the Weirdwolf persona. Half of the Coaches in the GPEFL are between the ages of 11-14, including Schmidt's daughter Kiri. In addition, Weirdwolf and **Robert Thomas** of McPherson, KS, were invited last year to Hill City, KS, for the annual Battle of Plains Semi-Pro Football Game to introduce Electric Football to the 6th, 7th and 8th grade classes. It was a huge success, as they divided the kids into teams of two (one offensive coach, one defensive coach). A team of 8th grade girls defeated a pair of 6th grade boys in the title game, with all of the teachers eagerly cheering on the players.

EDGAR DOWNS WINS EFL SUPER BOWL 9

Three-time Super Bowl of Electric Football Champion Ron Bell, who served as color commentator for this year's EFL Super Bowl, wrote this story for PLUGGED IN!

For the first time in Electric Football Super Bowl history, a college team is the reigning Super Bowl Champion.

Edgar Downs of Gary, IN, coached the Oklahoma Sooners to the 9th Annual Electric Football Super Bowl Title at the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, IN, on January 19, 2003. The Sooners defeated the Seattle Seahawks, led by **Charles Vaughn** of Harrisburg, PA, 15-14, in the first Electric Football Super Bowl game ever to go into overtime.

The contest featured two dominating defenses that limited the first half scoring to a lone 54-yard Seahawk field goal as time expired. In typical EFL fashion, however, the fireworks weren't long in coming, as the Sooners returned the second half kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown and the lead. OU tacked on a two point conversion to go up 8 - 3.

Not to be outdone, the Seahawks took back the very next kickoff 100 yards, keyed by a splendid downfield block that allowed the returner to glide into the end zone. Another two-point conversion gave the Seahawks an 11 - 8 lead.

The score remained the same as the fourth quarter began. But a long, time-consuming drive by Oklahoma, capped by a 30 yard TD run up the middle midway through the final quarter, put the Sooners ahead again. Coach Downs opted to go for another two-point conversion, but the Seahawks' defense rose to the challenge and made the stop, keeping the game close: Sooners 14, Seahawks 11.

With the clock winding down in regulation, the Seahawks quickly moved into field goal range. With three seconds remaining, Coach Vaughn decided to attempt a game-tying field goal and take his chances in overtime. Despite Coach Downs' attempts at "icing" the Seahawk kicker by calling two consecutive time outs, the ball split the uprights as regulation time expired, tying the game at 14-14.

The overtime format allowed for one play to be run from the 50-yard line by each team to pick up one point—with the greater total yardage determining the winner. The Seahawks had the first possession and courageously attempted a difficult pass play. The ball fell to the turf, though, resulting in the Sooners needing only one yard for the win.

From the "I" formation, the tailback took the handoff and slipped past the first tackler, gaining enough yardage to make EF Super Bowl history. Final Score: Sooners 15, Seahawks 14. The crowd of fans and media—realizing that it may have

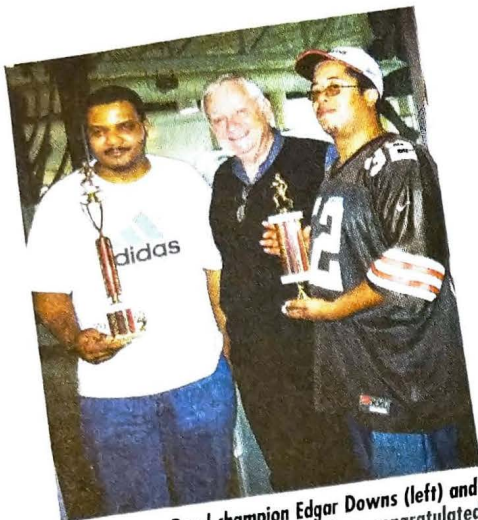

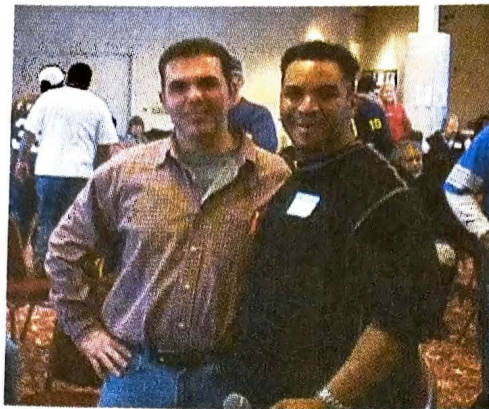

"I've always wanted to be the champion," Coach Downs said afterwards. The highly accomplished Downs can now add the prestigious Miggle trophy to his collection. ■

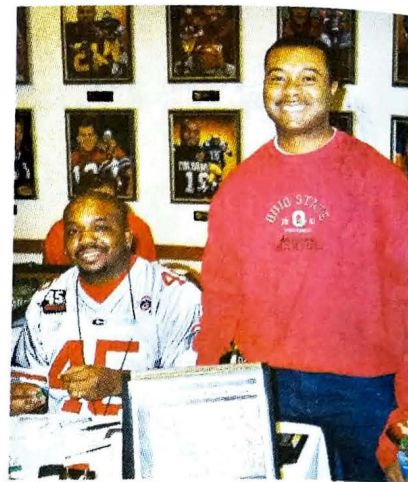

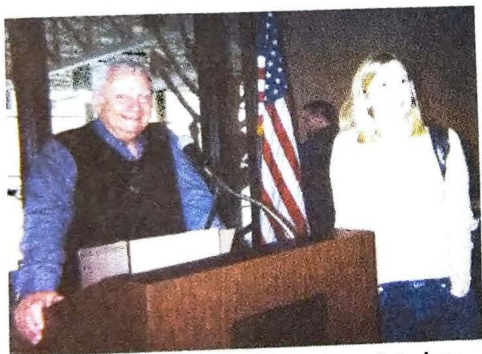

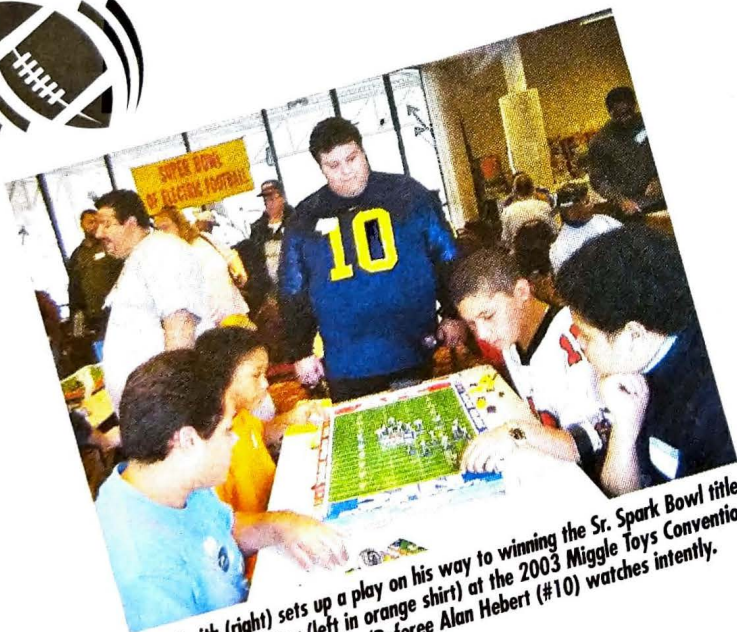

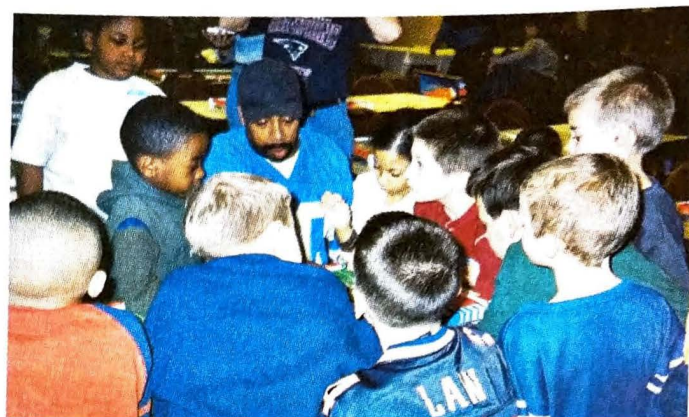

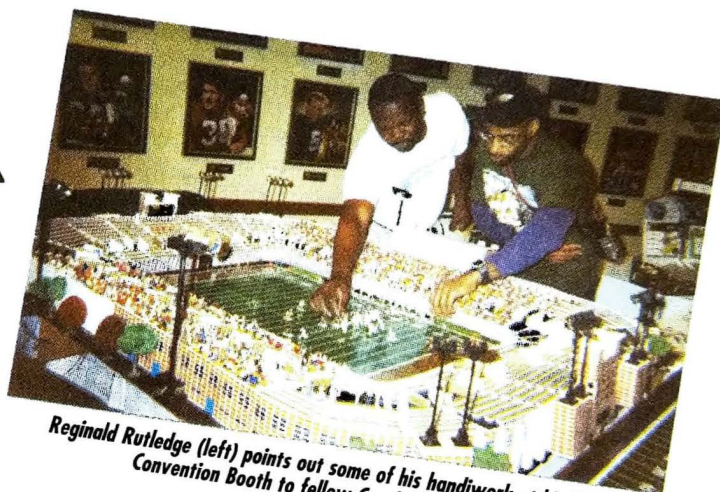

Spotlight On: MIDWEST & NEW YORK EFLS

MIDWEST EFL THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

Question: What's one of the most competitive, largest and most creative EFL leagues in the country? If you answered, the **Midwest Electric Football League**, you would be right.

Founded in 1996 by a trio of childhood friends from Gary, IN—2003 EFL Super Bowl champion **Edgar Downs** plus **Frank Johnson** and **Terrence Anderson**—the MWEFL now has 14 Coaches causing sparks from Chicago, to Northwest Indiana to Central Indiana.

The other Coaches are the father/son duo of **Jimbo Dunagan, Sr.** and **Jimbo Dunagan, Jr.**, **Bob Fane**, **Matt Wavra**, **Rob Vetor**, **Ron Christianson**, brothers **Alex** and **Adrian Seldon**, **Ron Bradley**, **Al Coleman** and **Reggie Johnson**. Incredibly, every league coach attended the 9th Annual Official Super Bowl & Convention except Anderson and Reggie Johnson.

"The trademark of the MWEFL," Frank Johnson told PLUGGED IN!, "is that we are one of the few leagues in the country that utilizes a 'strategy divider' or 'huddle separator' during play set up. In this style of EFL, a board is placed perpendicular to the line of scrimmage as the offense and defense align their figures. The board prevents the opposing coaches from seeing each other's formation during the initial set-up phase, which we feel enhances the sophistication of the game."

But the personalities are also what helps make the MWEFL stand out so much. While two of the NFL's oldest and fiercest antagonists reside in the Midwest: Green Bay Packers vs. Chicago Bears, one of the classic EFL rivalries is also ensconced here: Downs vs. Johnson. It's a competition that has been going on for more than 25 years, with each Coach having taken home two MWEFL titles while becoming well-known on the national EFL stage, as well.

As you would expect from such enthusiastic and dedicated coaches, the members of the MWEFL are extremely active in promoting and helping to grow Electric Football. From sharing their passion of the game with friends and family, to doing interviews with the media to participating in clinics and other tutoring activities, the MWEFL Coaches truly believe in "giving back."

Many of the MWEFL Coaches have stood out in other ways, as well.

Frank Johnson, who may have been the first "fly coach" in EFL history by jetting between Chicago and Dallas for two seasons to compete in the Dallas-Fort Worth EFL, has also been involved in writing Official National EFL Rules and Miggle Toys Tournament Rules—as well as being a pioneer in composing Electric Football song parodies.

Jimbo Dunagan, Sr. has been a leading developer of an electric football version of Arena Football.

While Terrence Anderson has created his own fantasy franchise (the Portland Pirates), complete with uniforms, team colors, logo and roster that he uses in MWEFL play, Ron Bradley is a prolific painter of EFL figures, having completed every NFL team and dozens of college squads.

BIG APPLE COACHES LAUNCH NEW EFL LEAGUE

While most major cities across the U.S. have been the home for Electric Football Leagues that have made significant impacts in the hobby for the past five to 10 years, the nation's largest metropolitan area—New York—has been conspicuously absent from most EFL news and accomplishments over this time span.

That is, until now!

The **New York Electric Football League (NYEFL)**, comprised of eight veteran Coaches from Long Island, New York City, Westchester County (NY) and Connecticut, kicked off its inaugural season in February 2003 with a 10 game schedule. Renowned for its explosive passing attacks and high scoring encounters, the NYEFL has been likened to the American Football League (AFL) of the 1960's.

"We play a wide open and exciting brand of Electric Football," enthused NYEFL Commissioner **Joe Rivera**, a truck driver from Huntington, NY, who is a 20-year veteran of the game. "Since our group includes coaches who have played Electric

Football all over the country, we feel we already have one of the most electrifying, competitive and creative leagues in the U.S." Rivera will coach his hometown NY Jets in the NYEFL.

In early March, **Mickey Mantle's Restaurant**, located at 42 Central Avenue South in Manhattan (212/688-7777), offered to host all NYEFL games on Sunday afternoons at no charge to the league. "They are playing right in the front windows directly across from Central Park where thousands upon thousands of New Yorkers and tourists pass every Sunday," explained **Ira H. Silverman** of Silverman Media&Marketing Group, who negotiated the arrangement on behalf of Miggle Toys.

The roster of other NYEFL Coaches, who will play EFL "seasons" year-round, includes:

- Manhattan-native **Paul "Ground" Gardner** (coaching the Denver Broncos), a journalist/poet with 30 years of EFL experience;
- Former semi-pro football player **Wally Jabs** of Great River, NY, (NY Giants), a consulting engineer with Cisco Systems who was the runner-up at the EFL Super Bowl 3 in Chicago in 1997;
- **Dave "Air" Jimenez** of Patchogue, NY (Oakland Raiders), a page editor who has three decades of Electric Football experience under his belt;
- **Solomon Maye** (Tampa Bay Bucs), a 21-year-old boxer from New Haven who has been playing Electric Football since he was 11;
- Former Western Kentucky Hilltopper QB **Johnny "Hurricane" Thomas** (Miami Dolphins), a departmental manager from Tarrytown, NY;
- Seven-time Connecticut EFL Champion **John Wharton** of New Haven (St. Louis Rams), a restaurant manager who has been playing the game for 38 years;
- Construction worker **Thomas Wharton** (Pittsburgh Steelers) of New Haven, CT, who has been playing the game for 20 years.
