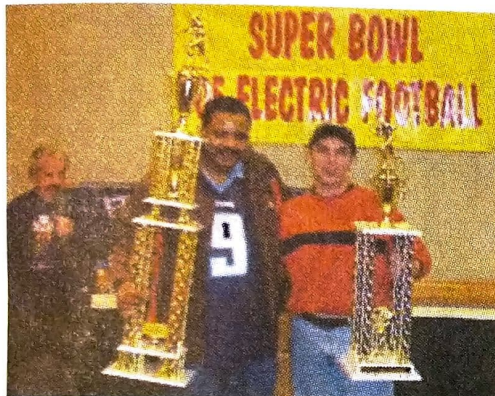

DOWNES & BELL BATTLE IT OUT IN EFL SUPER BOWL 10

It was only appropriate that the two coaches who opposed each other for the **Super Bowl of Electric Football 10** Miggle Trophy on Sunday, Jan. 24, 2004, would be the defending champion vs. the only three-time winner.

It was a match-up made in EFL Heaven and set up by the expertise of the "Miggle Draw Committee," who made the two coaches the No. 1 seeds in the NFL and AFC Conferences before play began.

10TH ANNIVERSARY CONVENTION RATED #1 OF ALL-TIME

According to virtually every attendee at the 10th Anniversary Official Electric Football Super Bowl & Convention held over the weekend of Jan. 23-25, 2004, in the Chicago suburb of Deerfield, IL, the event was an incredible success and exceeded their expectations in most every way. Which is really saying something – since we all know just how high EFL coaches' expectations can get!

Miggle Toys' "Management Team" of **Michael and Delayne Landsman** outdid themselves this year in planning and putting on their 10th Anniversary Electric Football "celebration."

The stage was set for a memorable afternoon.

Starting off the festivities with a rousing and operatic version of the National Anthem was **Nancy Landsman**, the daughter-in-law of **Michael and Delayne Landsman**, owners of Miggle Toys. The referee was introduced, **Stephen R. Pamon**, who works both collegiate and Arena Football League games – and then it was game time.

On one side of the giant Miggle EFL board stood Coach **Edgar Downs** of Gary, IN, who led the St. Louis Rams to the 2003 EFL Super Bowl title. On the other side of the metal gridiron was New Orleans' **Ron Bell**, who had captured Super Bowls 6, 7 & 8 with the Miami Dolphins. Announcing and commentary duties for the thrilling game were performed with great skill and humor by **Ken Allen** of Detroit, MI and **Frank Johnson** of Gary, IN.

The opening play set the tone for the afternoon: the game would be well-played, tense and exciting.

St. Louis kicked off, and the Dolphins' Jay Fiedler returned the ball 90 yards to the Rams' 10-yard line. QB Dan Marino quickly hit Larry Csonka with a TD pass and, with the EP, put the Dolphins up 7-0. The Rams took the ensuing kick-off and marched methodically down the field, scoring on a short run by Marshall Faulk. A 2-point conversion put Downs' team ahead, 8-7.

There was new excitement, new faces, new tournament rules, new tourney bases, the most elaborate trophies yet – all beginning with a great party Friday night and ending with a victory by Edgar Downs in the Super Bowl on Sunday afternoon.

"We wanted to make our **10th Anniversary Convention** not only the best one ever, but totally unparalleled and completely memorable," **Delayne Landsman** told PLUGGED IN! "We feel we surpassed our objectives and gave our coaches and their families a weekend they will remember for a long, long time."

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With time running out in the first half, the Dolphins scored again on a Marino to Jim Kiick TD toss, resulting in a 14-8 half-time lead for Bell's boys after the conversion.

The Rams quickly evened the count in the 3rd quarter, as QB Kurt Warner threw a short pass to Faulk, who scooted 56 yards for the TD. St. Louis missed the EP, leaving the score knotted at 14.

Miami then took possession, but its drive was stalled midway through the fourth quarter on a sensational sack by the Rams' free safety, Aeneas Williams – resulting in one of the few punts in EFL Super Bowl history.

The Rams were mired deep in their own territory as regulation time expired. For the second year in a row, the Miggle Super Bowl would go into overtime, with each team getting one play from the 50-yard line to see who could gain the greater amount of yardage.

Downs won the toss and elected to have Bell's team work first. After the Dolphins gained six yards on their play, Coach Downs sent out a pack of receivers, hitting a pass of nearly 30 yards for his second straight Miggle Trophy triumph.

As Michael Landsman commented after the game was over: "It just doesn't get any better than this!" ■

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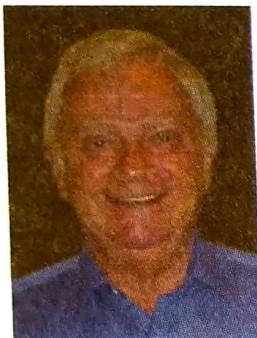

WHERE IN THE WORLD IS THE OEFEFL?

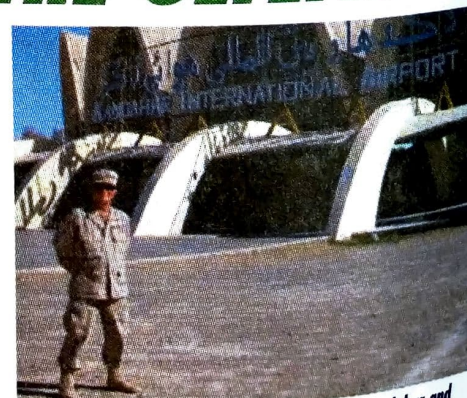
Many of us have played Electric Football under difficult circumstances: the room was too cold or too hot, the electricity went out in the middle of the game or the in-laws popped in for an unannounced visit just as the fourth quarter was beginning.

But those "challenges" don't hold a candle to the hardships that **Coach/2nd Lieutenant David Haydel** and his fellow Electric Football League members face every day – whether or not they have a chance to play Electric Football. That's because Haydel and his buddies are currently stationed with the 205th Engineer Battalion of the Louisiana National Guard in **Kandahar, Afghanistan**.

When Haydel, a member of his hometown New Orleans EFL, arrived in Afghanistan last year, he sought out a fun, social activity to do with his fellow troops during their free time as an alternative to being on the computer or watching movies – which he felt were neither interactive, nor communal.

So he got together with six fellow soldiers from Louisiana, placed an order for an Electric Football game to be sent to him in Afghanistan and together they launched the **Operation Enduring Freedom Electric Football League (OEFEFL)**. Michael and Delayne Landsman of Miggle Toys were so surprised when they received the order from the Middle East that they decided to send the game board to Haydel at no charge as a small measure of their gratitude to this valiant soldier.

According to Haydel, who spoke via long-distance and e-mail with **PLUGGED IN!** reporter Morgan Futch of Silverman Media&Marketing Group, out of the six men he recruited for his league, only one had ever played the game (as a child), while the rest were all new to the hobby. Regardless of the coaches' inexperience, the OEFEFL took off and quickly caused quite a "buzz" around the base.

"We used to regularly play on Tuesday nights, and we would typically have about a dozen or so spectators around us – people who just wanted to

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GETTING CONNECTED WITH...BRUCE MURRAY

A 20-year veteran of the sports broadcasting field, **Bruce Murray** is the host of the highly-popular, nationally-syndicated *"Murray In The Morning"* program heard in more than 125 markets across the country on the *Sporting News Radio* network.

Early in his career, Bruce, who was originally from New York City and now lives in Chicago, was intimately involved in the launch of the nation's first all-sports radio station, New York's WFAN, in 1987. Since then, he has also worked at ESPN Radio and Washington, D.C.'s all-sports radio station, WTEM.

Bruce joined *Sporting News Radio* in March 1996 as the co-host of its *Sports*

Saturday and *Sports Sunday* shows. Today, you can listen to his show on a station in your area or via the Internet at: www.sportingnewsradio.com.

Bruce was reintroduced to *Electric Football* this past January when *"Murray in the Morning"* and Miggle teamed up for a promotion that included the cast of the morning show playing the game on air during the week leading up to the '04 Convention – and culminated in an interview with Commissioner **Michael Landsman** and a classic live, on-air battle between the overmatched host and **Ron Bell**, the three-time Miggle Super Bowl Champion.

Plugged IN! (PI!): Do you remember the first Electric Football game you ever had?

Bruce Murray (BM): Sure. I was seven years old and my parents gave it to me for Chanukah. Like most Jewish kids, I received a lot of gifts over the years for Chanukah – but my *Electric Football* game was certainly one of the very best presents I ever received as a child.

PI!: Did you play a lot when you were younger?

BM: I played *Electric Football* all the time as a kid. Of course, I mostly played it as 'football' – but sometimes I would use my imagination and create other forms of sports with the game. For example, I would make the figures race down the field, or I would make them wrestle each other. I stopped playing when I was about 15.

PI!: With whom did you usually play?

BM: I mostly played by myself. But I also played with my friends on occasion. I found it also was a great game to play solitaire; you could line up your players for both teams. Unlike Ron Bell, I never mastered passing, so my game was all running.

PI!: What was your initial reaction when you were contacted by Miggle Toys in early January 2004 and the *Electric Football* Game was delivered to you?

BM: I was actually very excited to learn that this game was still around; it brought back many childhood memories – it was a key figure in my childhood.

PI!: Watching a pro like Ron Bell play, did you have a new respect for the game?

BM: It did scare me a little to realize that someone could actually be that good at this game. There is so much skill involved that I do not think I could imagine myself ever being THAT good.

PI!: What do you think are some of the other positive aspects of the game today?

BM: I think the social aspect of *Electric Football* today is great! Also, guys can recapture their youth and – let's face it – guys like to compete.

Nobody gets hurt and it is very hard to cheat, so there is probably not a lot of animosity amongst players – you win, you lose, you laugh, it's great!

PI! What was the reaction from your listeners?

BM: A lot of the emails we got were very similar to what I just said, they also wanted to know where to purchase the game, they told us how it brought back nostalgic feelings. Most people grew up with this game and were laughing when they heard us playing. It's the kind of thing that you just hear the buzzzzz sound and

ELECTRIC FOOTBALL ASSISTS LONG ISLAND HIGH SCHOOL TO FOOTBALL TITLE

Most of today's high school football players are the recipients of 21st Century training, exercises and practice time technology, methods and knowledge. Then there's Freeport High School on Long Island, NY.

Freeport is a large high school on a busy highway in an ethnically-diverse and vibrant suburb of New York City. Although it has known great success on the gridiron in the past, no one would have had the courage to predict just what an incredible season the Red Devils would have in 2003 before the opening kick-off of Game One.

No one, that is, except **Kirt Smith**, Freeport's assistant head coach and offensive coordinator.

A full-time special ed. teacher in Queens, NY, Smith has spent his last few summers as the swim director at a pool in Nassau County, NY. There he became friendly with Miggle Toys' public relations and special events representative, Ira H. Silverman, who gave him an *Electric Football* game as a gift. The rest – as they say – is history.

"I had the game when I was a kid – and when

Ira gave it to me, I instantaneously knew exactly what I wanted it for," Smith told PLUGGED IN!.

What Coach Smith visualized was using the large, colorful metal "field" to help his players better understand offensive and defensive formations, since the metal gridiron was dimensionally correct and featured "yardage" markers and hash marks just like a real field. He went out and purchased 22 small round magnets, coloring half of them red for his Freeport team and preparing to switch colors for the other 11 according to the uniforms of the upcoming opponent.

"The board is 3-D, unlike a blackboard,"

Smith continued, "and by using the magnets, I could literally demonstrate to each player where he should be on any given play."

The players obviously learned well from their *Electric Football* lessons. The Red Devils blew through their Nassau County Division One regular season schedule (8-0), scoring 339 points and yielding just 13 (including six shut-outs). They beat their Nassau County Championships semifinal

opponent, Hempstead, 62-22, and defeated Farmingdale, 28-7, for the County title.

It was then on to Stony Brook University to meet the Suffolk County champs, William Floyd H.S., for the Long Island Division One Championship.

"The *Electric*

Football field is a fun kind of thing," Smith said before the Floyd game. "It works for most of the kids, and it works for me."

And it also seemed to work for the entire Freeport High School community, as the Red Devils passed and ran and defended themselves to a 40-7 pounding of Floyd to give them a perfect 11-0 season record, the Long Island Division One title and the unofficial title of "Buzz" Kings of New York State! ■

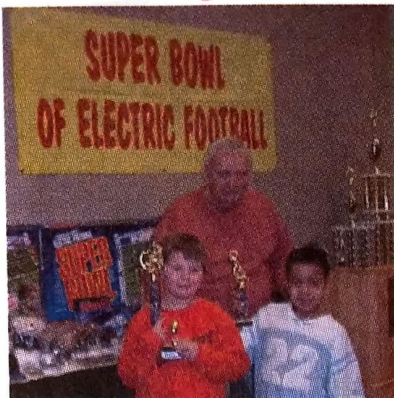
THERE WILL ALWAYS BE 'SPARKS' AT THE EFL CONVENTIONS

As the snow was falling and the wind was howling outside, the hearts were warm inside the ballroom of the Embassy Suites hotel just north of Chicago as children from ages 6 – 15 competed against each other in the Junior and Senior Spark Bowls during the 2004 EFL Convention.

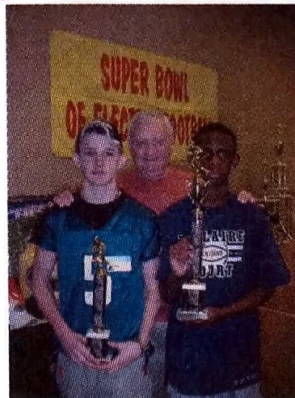
Thanks to an educational clinic for kids led by **Ben Neuhauser**, just-recently of Naperville, IL, nearly two dozen eager young coaches were able to sharpen their skills right before their tournaments began.

"As the children gathered around me to pick up some tips prior to their competitions, I was uplifted by their excitement and curiosity," stated Neuhauser. "They all took the time to listen to me, as well as to each other – and asked questions, all hoping to better their game."

The Junior Division had a dozen 6 to 11 year olds competing in a single elimination format. There were first timers – like seven-year-old Max Cotton of Chicago, who made it through to the second round (you may have seen Max's ear-to-ear smile on the National CBS News story) – competing

against veterans such as nine-year-old Kyle Nutt from Moore, SC, who took home the first place trophy.

"I practice all the time with my dad (EFL "pro" **Bryan Nutt**), and I knew this year I would have some tough opponents like **Luke Thompson**, who I played in the championship game," said Kyle. "But all my hard work paid off, and I got to go home to South Carolina with a big trophy."

Since many of the teenagers who usually compete in the Senior Division Spark Bowl decided

to test their skills against the adults in the Wild Card Tournament, only three strong 14-15 year old coaches entered the older division tournament. Miggle decided to hold a round-robin tournament among **Mathew Gavin** of Akron, OH, **Len Hargrave** of Nicholson, PA, and **Alex Ventressa** of Chicago to determine the two finalists for the Sr. Division championship.

The trio played an intense set of games, with Mathew and Len emerging with the best records. In the title game, Mathew outscored Len to earn the big Spark Bowl Sr. Division Trophy.

"Even though I only had to play against two other coaches, they were both really strong competitors and I had to be at the top of my game to come out on top," stated Mathew. "Next year, I may test my skills against the adults, so you can be sure that I will be practicing."

Miggle would like to thank the **Hebert brothers, Chris and Alan**, for once again helping to officiate all Spark Bowl competition. You guys are THE BEST! ■

OUR FIRST 'MEMORY' IS FROM DAVID ELENKO OF BAYSIDE, NY:

It was Christmas time 1976. I was 14 years old and I'd been playing solitaire Electric Football for two years. My grandfather was 80 years old and was a big football fan; he loved Penn State and the Raiders. He was at my house when he heard a buzzing sound coming from my room. My dad told him what it was, but he had to see it for himself. Not one for toys in general, he was immediately intrigued, laughed so loud – and when he saw my white Raiders he was in love! Are they winning, he asked? No Gramps, the Vikings got them, 10 to 7. That can't be, he said, the Raiders gotta beat them. Whose got the ball? The Raiders do. Let me see that, he said, and continued: Here put this back here and face him this way, and put this guy in front of him, gotta have blocking!

He gave the ball to Marv Hubbard and put Cliff Branch in front to block at the 40 yard line. Gramps, that's a wide receiver you put to block,

that's not right, I said! Don't worry, just make sure the line is in order! You can't make this stuff up. The man was 80, had thick glasses and couldn't see well, but he did know football! I turned on the switch ... buzzzzzzzz ... blocking is straight on ... Alan Page looms in the middle ... the Branch piece hits him, knocks him to the side into a linebacker and Hubbard lumbers straight through the hole and heads straight for the end zone. He's yelling GO, GO, GO like it's a real game. TOUCHDOWN! I knew it, he said feeling a great sense of accomplishment! Great call Gramps, you did it! That's some little toy you got there, he said, smiling and laughing. Raiders should hire me, huh? You know your football Gramps, and he was floating high. Why is this so unbelievably important to me – well, the best football mind I ever knew died a week later on JANUARY 4TH. He went very fast, but not as fast as Marv Hubbard did a week before!!

OUR SECOND 'MEMORY' IS FROM MARK NEWELL OF MOBILE, AL:

My favorite moment was finding out that other folks around the country liked Electric Football, too. I had been "in the closet" since 1970, playing either solitaire or games against my big brother when, in the early 1990s, I received a call from a man who said he used to work for Superior Toys, the company that had bought Tudor. He said they were starting a newsletter for Electric Football called "Plugged In!," and noticed that I had ordered stuff over the years and wanted to interview me for

their first fan topic in their newsletter. I reluctantly agreed. Since they had no mailing list, the first issues were inserted in boxes of games and, I guess, mailed to a few regular customers. Within a few months, I started receiving phone calls from all over the country from people I didn't know; people who said they played Electric Football, too – and all of a sudden we had a network!

All of this activity was before the Internet had taken off, but soon this guy from the Gulf Coast had new friends from Ohio (the Klingbeils and Dirk Thomas), Texas (Reginald Rutledge and Roddy Garcia), Maryland (Earl Shores), Illinois (Jim Jackson) and New Jersey (Joe Konopacki) and many others who started communicating by phone.

We talked about our hobby during those days. Roddy had the greatest collection in the world; Joe and I traded stuff; and being in the Chicago area, Jim always seemed to have access to what we needed. I flew to New York and went to a Giants game with Joe; met the Klingbeils at the Akron/Canton Airport; got my butt beat in Arlington at Reginald's tournament by a guy from Los Angeles with baby-oiled boiled bases.

Then the Internet took over, and we don't talk as much on the phone anymore. I still read the posts every day, chime in every now and then, but I miss the old days when a passion resurrected from our childhood broke the barriers of culture, color and creed and created new friendships and lasting memories. While talented gurus could obviously come up with nets and smaller-width goalposts more readily to resemble Arena Football, I found strategically placed core-board backing does the job nicely."

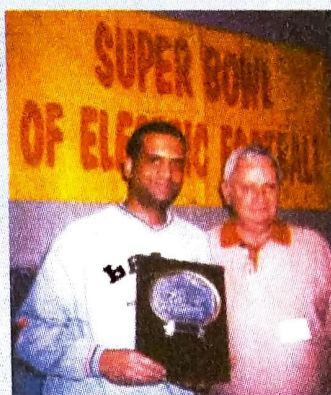


2003 EFL COACH OF THE YEAR AN EASY CHOICE

2003 EFL BREAKTHROUGH COACH OF THE YEAR

In conjunction with the staging of the 10th Anniversary Official Electric Football Super Bowl & Convention in January 2004, EFL Commissioner Michael Landsman and his wife, Delayne, believed the time was right to re-name one of the hobby's prominent awards so that it had a more meaningful title.

The result: the *Breakthrough Coach of the Year Award* (formerly the Newcomer of the Year Award) was born.

According to the Landsmans, the winner of the Breakthrough Coach of the Year Award would be "the one individual whose contributions and dedication to the game of Electric Football – along with his/her playing ability, creativity and enthusiasm – had most risen from the 'local' level to the national 'stage' in the previous 12 months."

The recipient of this newly-named award, announced during this year's Convention in Chicago, was **Tom Ruesink** from Lakeville, MN, who plays in the Grace Church Minnesota EFL.

In order to make this event a success, Tom signed up corporate sponsorship – including the involvement of the Minnesota Vikings – and held the tournament in a posh hotel in downtown Minneapolis. The Vikes also helped out by arranging for one of the team's all-time greats, running back Chuck Foreman, to make an appearance at the function, as well as by sending along the team's cheerleaders for pictures and autographs.

PLUGGED IN! spoke to Tom after he accepted his award at the 2004 Convention and asked him how he felt: "It was quite an honor to even be considered among the many people who've helped grow this hobby," he said happily. "Many of these coaches are like family to me. The award will always hold a special meaning to me. At the risk of sounding like Sally Field at the Oscars:

"They like me, they really like me!"

"Tom Ruesink is the epitome of the types of coaches who are playing Electric Football today," concluded Michael Landsman. "Not only is he skilled at the game, but he also shares his love of the hobby with his friends, his family and the community in which he lives. He really **did** make a breakthrough in 2003!"

WATT'S CURRENT

ELECTRIC FOOTBALL **Hot Tips**

EFL coach **David Elenko** of Bayside, NY, recently wrote a post on the Miggle Chatboard (www.miggle.com) asking other coaches to share their favorite **HOT TIPS** so that all coaches from around the country could learn new techniques, strategies and skills. Well, the EFL community has come through big-time – and Miggle will print a few of these TIPS in each future issue of **PLUGGED IN!** – so keep posting and we'll keep publishing.

From Patrick Casey, Jr. (Great Lakes EFL):
"I'll just go over some of the basics of "tweaking bases" with you. Pulling the prongs out will make bases faster. Flattening the prongs will make them stronger. You want to make sure your prongs are flat across (not rounded) for strength. The proper tools are flat needlenose pliers, flat pliers and nail clippers that are flat across, not rounded. There is more to do, but it just comes with experience. If you have any more questions, email me at diggerhythm@yahoo.com."

From Dr. Kurt Smeby, who currently lives in England:
"Just a few useful details which might help you win games: 1) Put strength towards the

middle of the formation and speed towards the outside when you allocate your bases; 2) Play to your strengths and your opponent's weaknesses; 3) Pick on the weak player or side of the field; 4) Remain consistent on where you line your people up unless you are going for a mis-match."

From Glenn Hardaway (Houston EFL):
"One of our HEFL coaches, Derrick Leffall, turned me onto this amazing technique to utilize with your TTQB: Use your thumbnail to flick the passes. Your thumb actually lines up geometrically perfectly with the TTQB, your hand and your arm. This is geometry at its finest, no angles involved. What it means is a deadly accurate straight-on pass that works almost all the time. It was awkward at first, but once I got used to it, it is the only way I pass now! Just be sure not to clip your fingernails too much! I once meant to leave a bit of my thumbnail when I was cutting it, but I clipped it down and there was nothing left to "catch" my hand on the TTQB! It cost my Packers a game and the team has still not forgiven me for that faux pas!" ■

check it out. To be honest, these folks would get pretty heavy into the games," stated Haydel.

The group started off playing informal pick-up games, but the competition soon developed into the official OEFEFL early last November, where coaches got to play each other twice so that they could gain experience and learn from each other's strategies. While their goal of trying to play games a few days a week didn't always work out, they always were able to get in their Tuesday evening matches.

At its height, in addition to Haydel, the members of the **Operation Enduring Freedom EFL** included **1st Lt. Scott Slaven**, **Staff Sgt. Pete Turnage** and **Specialists Todd Cusimano, Bradley Hill, Emanuel Taylor** and **Brian Williams**.

The first OEFEFL championship game, the "**Freedom Bowl**," pitted the Bears of **Specialist Hill**, who developed a strong passing game, vs. the Saints of **Specialist Cusimano**, whose squad answered with a great defense. The Saints were victorious in overtime, 27-21.

Unlike almost every other EFL league, the main worry of the OEFEFL is having its coaches transferred from the Kandahar base. At press time, Haydel and Slaven (whose Steelers team was taken over by **Staff Sergeant Pete Turnage**) had just been re-deployed for several months to a base north of Kandahar, where their current assignment is not conducive to playing Electric Football. Fortunately, however, they are able to receive e-mails from Specialists Hill and Cusimano, updating them on the league's progress and including some friendly trash talk, of course.

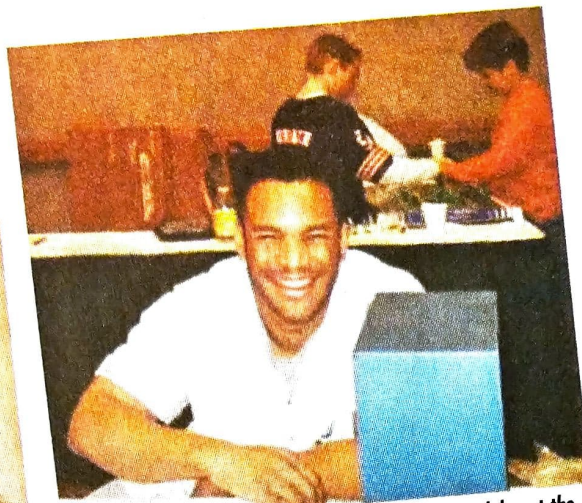




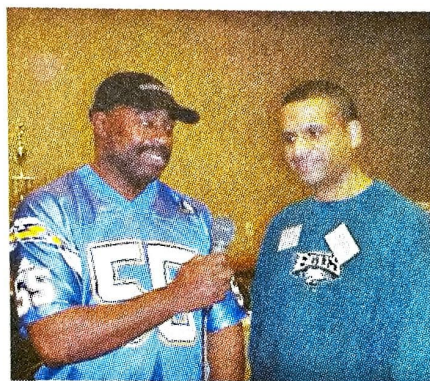

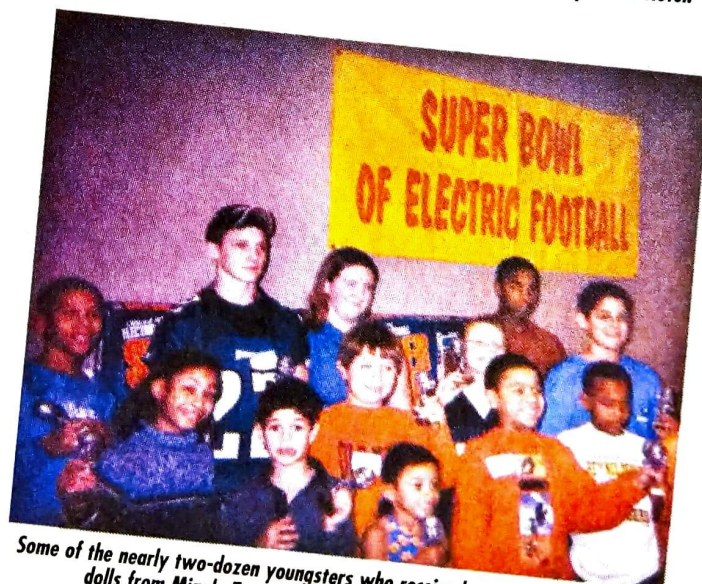

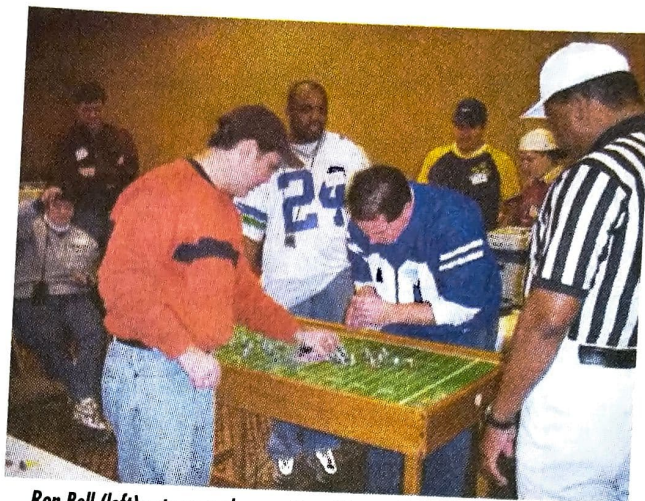

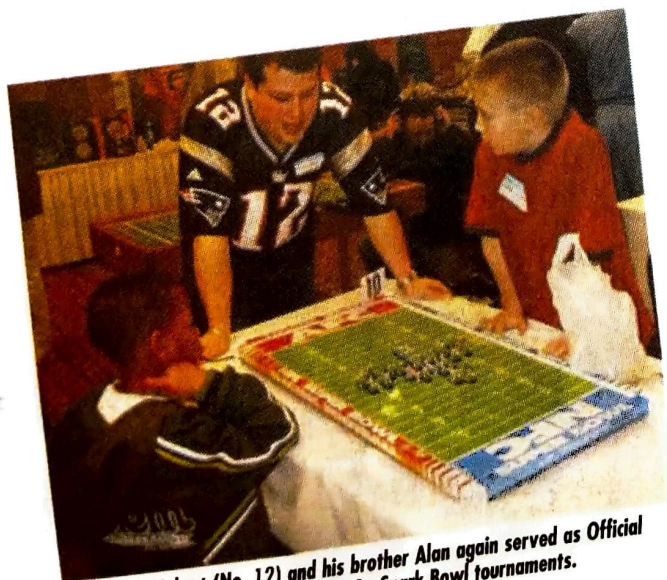

FIRST COAST EFL CONTINUES FLORIDA'S GRIDIRON GREATNESS

Florida is one of only two states (California is the other) to be the geographic host to three NFL football franchises. It also is the playground for a trio of college football teams that always rank among the best in the country (Miami, Florida and Florida State). And, in addition, it is the site of one of the most electrifying and growing **Electric Football Leagues** in the country.

Yes, the EFL is firmly entrenched in the city of **Jacksonville, FL** – which is also the home of the NFL's Jaguars and the 2005 Super Bowl – in the form of the **First Coast Electric Football League (FCEFL)**.

The FCEFL was originally formed in the Spring of 2001 by **Robert Wolford, Fran Henderson** and **Jack Miller**, all of Jacksonville. While their careers varied – Wolford is an internist, Henderson a medical administrator and Miller the lead anchor for the 4 and 10 p.m. News on the Fox-TV affiliate in Jacksonville – the three coaches' love of the game of Electric Football drew them to each other.

Today, the league boasts nine coaches – some of whom were recruited through the Miggle website and others via family ties – with the hope that three to four more will join in the next few months to make it an even dozen. The "newcomers" include **Tom Wolford**, Robert's brother, who is a cardiologist; **David Cobb**, a teacher, and his 14-year-old

son, **Aaron**; **Chris Bowman**, a stay-at-home dad; and Robert Wolford's two sons, **John**, age 11, and **Bobby**, nine, who will co-coach one squad. The league's Divisions are called "Beaches" and "City."

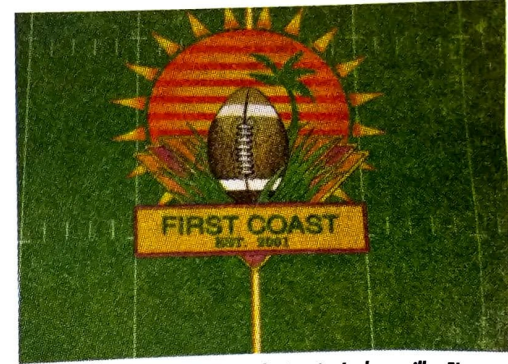
Consistent with the growth in the size of the league has been the improvement in the playing abilities and creativity of the coaches from year to year.

"Our quality of play has definitely gotten better over the years as we keep playing against each other," noted Wolford, whose cousin, Will Wolford, played pro football with the Buffalo Bills, the Indianapolis Colts and the Pittsburgh Steelers. "We have all learned how to manipulate the bases to make the figures run faster, plus our artistic skills in terms of painting and decaling the players is vastly better than it was before we all got together."

Thus far, Rob Wilford has won all four league championships, but the group says there are never any blowouts in the FCEFL. Furthermore, in its brief existence, the FCEFL has already gained considerable exposure and celebrity in its area, highlighted by a highly-complimentary article that ran in the *Florida-Times Union*, Jacksonville's major daily newspaper.

According to all of the coaches, among the major strengths of the FCEFL are the diversity of its members and the positive attitudes of sports-

manship and camaraderie with which they play. With members' ages ranging from 10 to 48, "it is a testament to our members that in almost four years of play there has never been one disagreement or sad face during or after a game. In fact, we have all developed long-lasting personal friendships with each other," asserted Wolford.

HALL OF FAMER MIKE DITKA IMPETUS FOR CHICAGO AREA EFL

Mike Ditka was an All-American tight end at the University of Pittsburgh, an All-Pro with the NFL's Bears, Eagles and Cowboys and a Super Bowl winning coach with Chicago. In fact, he was such a formidable player that he has been inducted into both the Pro Football and College Football Halls of Fame.

But Ditka's greatest legacy may be the fact that this Chicago adopted son is the inspiration for the town's **Windy City Boyz EFL**, monikered after the name Coach Ditka gave his strong Bears teams in the mid-'80s.

The league was born three years ago when a few buddies of **Pat Condon**, who all lived in the Chicago suburb of Beverly, IL, were sorting through artifacts in his home as they were helping him move. Just when they thought they were finished, they came across an old board game – Electric Football. Naturally, work halted and talk and play began.

"We all reminisced about the game and our childhoods – we forgot about all of life's hardships and focused on a kinder, easier time in our lives when we were pre-teenagers," Condon recently told PLUGGED IN! "Then we wiped the dust off the board and fired up a game. We lost track of time and must have played for six hours. We talked the next day and decided to set up a league – not knowing how big the EFL family was in the U.S. and worldwide."

The sensational six who started the Windy City Boyz EFL, all of whom are now 26-27 years old, include Condon, who is a pipe fitter; **Butch Murrihy**, a pallet distributor; **Eddie Edwards**, a locker room jockey; **Bucks Logue**, an electrician;

Mike Waddick, an entrepreneur; and **Bill Boehler**, an actor.

More recently they have been joined by **Bobby Duggan**, a home designer, and **Tim Gray**, a stockbroker.

Coaches meet at each other's homes every Sunday during the season to play Windy City Boyz EFL games. They try to challenge each other twice during the campaign – and even play outside unless it is raining or snowing!

The quirkiness of the league comes not during play, but afterwards. For example, the winners of the three league Super Bowls – Condon in 2001, Waddick in 2002 and Murrihy in 2003 – did not receive a trophy ... rather they were pulled around their neighborhood by the other players in a rickshaw.

(Editor's Note: This tradition has ended as the rickshaw was stolen after last year's Super Bowl.)

"Our goals for this year," noted Condon, "are to merge with another Chicago-area EFL and to have at least one of our coaches contend at next year's Miggle Convention. We also hope to have a Windy City Boyz EFL Website up and running soon."

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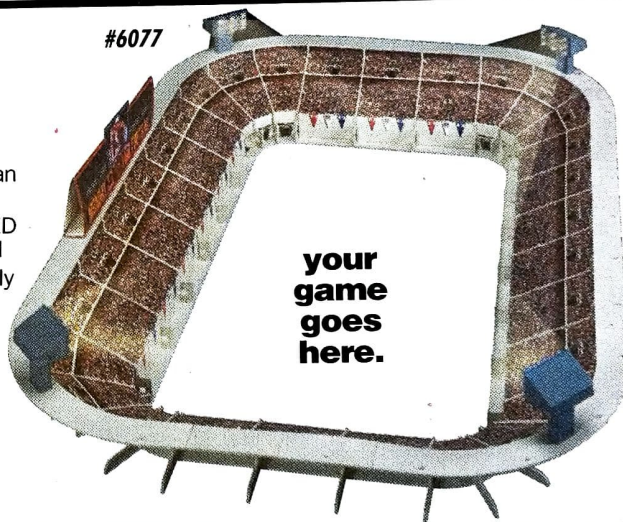
