THE MOTOR CITY TO HOST 14th ANNUAL EFL CONYENTION

The City known for being the Automobile Capital of the World, introducing the Motown Sound to America and home to some of the greatest Electric Football players and figure painters in the U.S. is hosting this year's Electric Football World Championships & Convention.

After many months of research and negotiations, Michael and Delayne Landsman of Miggle Toys are delighted to announce that the 2008 EFL World Championships & Convention will be held in Detroit from January 25-27 at the Embassy Suites Hotel-Livonia/Novi (Detroit, MI), located at 19525 Victor Parkway in Livonia, about 17 miles Northwest of the city's main Downtown area.

The 2008 event will mark the fifth consecutive year that an Embassy Suites property will serve as the host site of the weekend's festivities, which will continue the tradition of EFL coaches and their families enjoying all the conveniences, lodging space, complimentary extras and services that Embassy Suites so cheerfully provide.

The weekend will again kick-off with the highly-popular (and complimentary) Friday Night Reception & Dinner on Jan. 25, hosted by Delayne and Michael Landsman. Coaches will once more be able to sign up to compete in the 2008 World Championships on the Friday night and Saturday morning of the Convention, with the format providing every coach with the opportunity to play up to seven games in the opening round of the tournament before playoffs begin. The formats for the Jr. and Sr. Spark Bowls will be determined on-site once it is known how many young coaches enroll in each bracket.

The Landsmans are also promising a great number of surprises, new activities and contests and lots more excitement at the 2008 Convention with the help and input of all of the outstanding coaches in the Greater Detroit area.

Because of the large amount of coaches residing in Michigan and the surrounding states, Miggle expects a record turn-out for the 2008 Convention. 

GETTING CONNECTED WITH...EFL LEAGUES AROUND THE U.S.

CHARLOTTE EFL IN ROCHESTER, NY

In 1981, the sports world saw Richard Petty win the Daytona 500, the Dodgers defeat the Yankees, 4 games to 2, in the World Series following a 49-day players' strike, Larry Holmes rule the world heavyweight boxing division, the Raiders turn back the Eagles, 27-10, in Super Bowl XXV and Tom Watson earn the green jacket at The Masters golf tournament.

It turns out that 1981 also was the year that the Charlotte EFL of the Greater Rochester region of New York State was born—and has been going strong ever since!

The Commissioner of the League is **John DiCarlo**, who told **PLUGGED IN!** that there are eight coaches in the CEFL who play from late October through the beginning of April in "Subterranean Stadium" (his basement), which is situated in the village of Charlotte (pronounced shar-lot), NY, which is located at the farthest north point in Rochester.

While Subterranean Stadium can only accommodate eight coaches and some seasons were lost between 1995 and 2005 because "of many of life's problems such as work and health," says DiCarlo, "we never disbanded as a league and we are now going as strong as ever and having more fun than ever."

The CEFL has two divisions—the Amps and the Volts—play a 14 game schedule followed by Playoffs and an All-Star Game. But the league really is all about camaraderie and family.

In addition to John and Dave Paprocki, both of whom are retired postal workers, and Ronnie Minni, John's grandson and a high school sophomore, the other five members of the Charlotte EFL are: Jim VanVelson, a retired mason; Peter (Hotsman) Dietz, a retired construction trade worker; Mike O'Neill, a contractor; Jim (Duke) DiCarlo, who's involved in assisted living building maintenance; and Wayne Root, a plumber. The designated "sub" is

Kyle Paprocki, a 13-year-old 8th grader. "All of the coaches are great friends who have known each other for many, many years through good times and bad," conceded DiCarlo, "but Electric Football has been the glue that binds. The game has kept us all young at heart. We must be because our oldest player is 60 and we have only one coach under 50—my grandson Ronnie, who is 15. The game never gets old like we do."

Remarkably, Ronnie is the reigning champion of the CEFL. Notes his grandfather: "We all blame it on our bad eyesight, but it's really because I taught him to play the game when he was three years old. His passing game is unreal!

The group's favorite anecdote involves the *one and only time* the league had to play outside Subterranean Stadium due to nine consecutive days of rain that flooded DiCarlo's basement before the last tilt of the season (the All-Star Game). They had to use another coach's home, where the wife of the house got to see the "boys" in action for the very first time. "As we were leaving," recalls DiCarlo, "she told me she thought that us guys getting together every week was something special"...and to us it still is!

GREAT LAKES ELECTRIC FOOTBALL LEAGUE IN TAYLOR, MI

As the Host League for the 14th Annual Miggle Electric Football World Championships & Convention, the Great Lakes Electric Football League is already gearing up to help put on a superlative event right in their own backyard.

According to Steve Martin (superior Electric Football coach and painter extraordinaire—and not that wild and crazy guy from

TV's SNL), the GLEFL was originally formed when a group playing out of Ann Arbor, MI, and a assemblage of coaches based in Detroit merged into a **Monster** League that now includes a remarkable 30 players, including coaches from as far away as Akron and Columbus, OH, and Gary, IN.

All league games in their full 16 game schedule are played in Taylor, MI, which is about 17 miles from downtown Detroit.

Now in its seventh season (the league kicked-off its 2007 campaign on Sept. 9), no individual coach has won the coveted league championship more than once. Perhaps that's because of the depth of talent among the league members, ranging from past Miggle EFL Super Bowl Champions Mark Klingbiel and Norbert Revels to dynamic contenders such as Frank

TRAINING CIRCUIT: TOP EFL COACHES PROVIDE TIPS ON KICK-OFFS

Of course, it is a cliché to say that no football game can begin without a kick-off, but doing it—and doing it right—are two entirely different things.

That's why the debut article in the new section that PLUGGED IN! is introducing in this issuecalled TRAINING CIRCUIT—is focusing on the best ways to return a kick-off and the optimum methods of defending against long run backs.

And who better to join our Training Circuit in this edition of PLUGGED IN! than four of the top coaches in the business? If you want to learn how to start the game on offense in great field position ... or pin your opponent back in their own territory at the beginning of a contest, then read ahead for some very valuable lessons.

First, here's an overall look at the kick-off and the kick-off return from noted coach Myron Evans of the Philadelphia EFL:

KICK-OFF STRATEGY

In the PEFL, once both teams have set up for the kickoff, the field is turned on for two seconds to simulate hang-time on the kick. The kicking team then kicks off, directing the kick in a direction where there is the most coverage. The return team then puts a kick returner on the field based on where the ball is kicked. The kicking team is then allowed to turn any unengaged players towards the kick-returner, and in return, the receiving team can also turn players to block.

THE STRATEGY

(Receiving Team)

Since you would like players to stay back and block for the returner, it doesn't make sense to use fast players that run straight ahead because they'll run away from the coverage and not be able to block.

I place 10 tackle players across the front line with TTC

bases that are slow and will run in a slow circle so that they don't run down the field and can stay back to block. I want the tackle figure because it has the long arms that can hook on to the kicking team's figures and prevent them from gaining penetration. If, after the two seconds are up, there are coverage players close to the receiving team players, those players can be turned to block because they have not run down the field away from the coverage team. I want a kick-returner who is fast, bounces out of piles and can run to either side to beat the coverage.

THE STRATEGY (Kicking Team)

Once the hang-time has expired, I look at the coverage to see where I have the most unengaged players to turn towards the returner and I kick in that direction. I want the opposite of the receiving team. I want the fastest players set up across the line who can get in the vicinity of the kick-returner

as fast as possible to make the receiving team have to make a decision, as to whether to return the kick, or to take it at the 20 yard line. Since we are allowed to turn players that have gone out of bounds, sometimes I will point a few players to go out of bounds so that they can not be effectively blocked, freeing them up to be turned towards the returner without being caught up in a pile or being blocked.

Notes Mike Guttman of New Hope, MN: Every coach's dream is to return the kick-off for a TD since it's an easy six points in football. In most situations, the return team must choose their return man before the return starts, so you are planning the return

before you know the situation. Some will pick loopers to try a sideline return, while others will just try the safest route up the middle of the field. The goal for most coaches is to get past the 20yard line. If there is no chance of that happening, the safest call is to take the touchback and start at the 20. The rules do play a big part in how you decide to return the kick-off.

Add Keith Schultz and Twain Pigott of Baton Rouge, LA: "It is usually best to try to 'unintentionally' slip in an extra player and see if

EFL COACHES PREDICT WHO WILL MEET IN BCS CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

With Miggle Toys aligning itself with the college game this year, PLUGGED IN! thought it was an ideal opportunity in early September 2007 to survey EFL coaches all over the country to see who they predicted would reach-and win-the BCS Championship Game in the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans on January 7, 2008.

A rousing 86% of those questioned picked the University of Southern California (USC) to make the grade for the title tilt, with 54.5% of the voters picking the Trojans to win it all. The most popular predicted match-up was USC and Louisiana State University (LSU), with five coaches picking USC to win this battle vs. two opting for the Tigers.

West Virginia received four votes to meet USC in the Sugar Bowl clash, with half the responders saying the Mountaineers would win and half stating that the Trojans would be victorious. Other multiple choices included USC over Texas and Ohio State University beating USC (although one voter in this group gave the University of Florida an equal chance to eke out a spot in the game over USC).


Single votes had the Trojans beating Florida State, the University of Michigan over Ohio State; the Buckeyes overtaking USC or Florida; Virginia Tech defeating Texas; Florida beating USC; the University of California at Berkeley beating

Nebraska; and the Gators defeating intrastate rival, the University of Miami.

Among those coaches who predicted a USC victory (with their comments) were:

Terry Redden of Kearney, NE: "I predict it'll be USC over Texas in the title game. These two powerhouses have the best athletes in the nation and the coaches are very savvy at mentoring that superior talent."

Aaron C. Johnson, Sr., of Canal Winchester, OH: "I think USC has a seasoned team with a coaching staff that has been there and done that over the years. While LSU is strong and they are loaded with plenty of weapons and a tough defense, USC will win the game—but it won't be easy."



Jake Silverman of S. Bellmore, NY: "USC will defeat West Virginia because they're just loaded and nasty. W. Va. will make it because RB Steve

Terrence Williams of Novi, MI:

"USC is going to beat LSU because their overall offense and defense are better and USC has something to prove because of what happened last year."

Here are a few additional predictions from coaches around the country:

David Haydel of New Orleans:

"It'll be LSU and USC, with the Tigers taking it all. They will be playing in their own backyard and USC is due for



Ralph Hawkins of Oklahoma City: "I pick West Virginia over USC in the National Title Game. The Mountaineers play a 'cake' schedule in a conference with no title game...and the same goes for USC."

Joyce Rogers of Akron, OH: "I am picking Ohio State to beat either USC or Florida. The Buckeyes have talent and a long history of winning. Notre Dame and Michigan have already taken losses."

Gary Pate of Oxford, AL: "LSU will beat USC. The Tigers have it all together and it's time for them to do it. They have a lot of talent."

Keith Schultz of Baton Rouge, LA: "Even though I'm from this area, I'm not picking LSU for the Championship Game mainly because I went to school in Mississippi and I don't really like the Tigers. So, for me, it will be West Virginia over USC. I would have picked another school besides USC, but they've got such an easy schedule compared to the Southeastern Conference teams."

From Rodney Hankins of Brooklyn NY:
"When it comes to Electric Football, over the years I've noticed that people are the closest when they are at the Miggle Conventions. Family and friends from all over the US come together for one great weekend of fun. For my own interests, I talked to two people about how they made special friendships over the years through Electric Football.

"Steven Martin from Detroit, MI, who started playing Electric Football at age four, and has been competing ever since, told me about the time he came to the second convention in Chicago, IL.

"He was displaying the Miggle Stadium that he had built and met Reggie Rutledge from Texas. They became fast friends. Over the years they would go out to dinner and Reggie would talk about Electric Football, family and friends," Martin told me.

"Later on, Steve met **Jamal Lockhart** a Police Officer from Florida. "Big Lock they call him," said Martin. "We became very close; we talk about the game of Electric Football and the different plays."

"One of the tournaments they went to is called the Sea Wall Brawl in Virginia, an event held to raise money for police officers who fell in the line of duty. After the event was over Jimmy Lockhart, a relative of Jamal's, rented a car and the three of them drove to the Navy Museum at the Washington Navy Yard. "To see those war ships, that was a great experience that I will never forget," Martin told me.

"Paul Bartels, known to us as Raiderman, is

someone I met at the Miggle Convention a few years later in Washington, DC. Paul has been playing the game for 22 years, so he wanted to go to the Convention to see if he could win the whole thing. It was at that Convention where he met **Jim Davis.**

Over that weekend and at other tournaments, they would frequently play against each other. Paul does not remember if he won or lost—although, more likely, he lost. Afterward, they went to a restaurant and "ate so much food the restaurant had to close for the night," Bartels said.

"The person who really stands out for me is a fellow I met at the DC Convention, **Brian Wittkop**, **Sr. from Michigan**. Brian has not been physically well, and he has been on dialysis for some time, so he cannot travel as much as he used to. Paul e-mail's him and sends him things; Brian is a big college football fan. Michigan is his team. Out of all the people Paul met at these conventions, Paul is most excited to see Brian this coming year in Detroit.

"As for me, I met my friend when I was in Philadelphia for my first convention (Convention #5 in January 1999). Saturday morning came and I went to get something to eat. I sat next to a woman and her family. They asked me if I was here for the convention, and I said, 'Yes I am.' Then they asked me if I was by myself, and I repeated, 'Yes, I am.' They then invited me to sit with them—it turned out to be Cindy Hargrave and her family, from Pennsylvania.

"Since that day, I feel so close with them that they are almost a part of my family. When I was going through some personal problems, I did not know to whom I could speak. From Bernard Laster of Woodbridge, VA, who entitles his story, "New Friends Meet and Old Friends Reunite through EFL."

YOU PLAY SOLITAIRE ELECTRIC FOOTBALL, YOU'RE NOT ALONE



While Electric Football is continuing to grow and flourish in all corners of the U.S. these dayswith leagues popping up literally everywhere there still are areas and times when organized group play is just not possible. Rather than putting aside their figures and boards, however, a

multitude of EFLers in this situation have turned to playing Solitaire Electric Football—either as a relaxing and rewarding recreational pastime or in leagues they create for themselves or with relatives and friends living a large distance away.

So to keep pace with this growing Electric Football phenomenon, PLUGGED IN! asked some of the most frequent and adept "Solitairers" to share their strategies, gamesmanship and playing styles with us so more of our readers can take part in this fascinating and challenging style of the game.

Ray Fanara of Brookville, MD (rfanara@verizon.net) uses Passing Sticks (i.e., lengths of wood cut at varying lengths for quick measurements). Depending on the distance between the QB and the intended receiver, he uses a different length stick to gauge the distance between the receiver and the ball placed on the field. Commonly referred to as a "pass simulation" or a "pass placement," the sticks increase strategy and promote impartiality.

He also employs play-action on most downs, wherein the QB starts each play with the ball and has the option to pitch/hand-off, pass or keep the ball. This technique allows the play to develop on its own with the Solitaire coach taking the best option as it presents itself to resolve the play.

"If you are a coach who also competes in tournaments and/or regular leagues," shared Fanara with PLUGGED IN!, "when you play Solitaire, use the rule sets you generally play by to gain familiarity with them and to become accustomed to the rules you will be using in competition. To accommodate multiple rule-sets, set-up a short season using one set of rules, and then start another season utilizing another set of rules.

Fanara also recommends—when involved in Solitaire competition that coaches use basic defenses against a wide variety of plays, both runs and passes, to improve their results and their enjoyment of the game.

Ralph Hawkins of Oklahoma City and his son Adam of Minot, ND, as well as brothers Rob and Tim Plush of Colorado Springs, CO, who also are the Hawkins' cousins, are all EFL Solitaire players, too. Their leagues and teams encompass current NFL, NCAA, Arena, CFL and even high school teams, as well as defunct leagues, such as the WFL and USFL-and in the future, they plan to add squads from the XFL and WLAF.

They point out that the most important rule in Solitaire play is to stay consistent with the way you play. "There are only so many offensive, defensive and special team formations that our 'league' allows," they told PLUGGED IN!, "so we all use the roll of the dice and an 'outcome chart' for passing, field goals and extra points."

The EFL quartet has their champions meet in title games once a year during the NFL Draft Weekend in late April in the Black Hills of Spearfish, South Dakota.

In their Solitaire play, there is no "stacking" allowed—which is several lines or "bunching up" of defenders at the line of scrimmage. There also is no "hooking" allowed, where a coach intentionally sets up a defender to hook the other player's arm when going into a pass route.

"If an offensive team is in a third or fourth down and long situation," stated Ralph Hawkins (Ralph.Hawkins@tinker.af.mil), "they must pass— as real teams would. If a team is losing by a significant margin, then they can exclusively pass-again, to

emulate actual football strategy."

While an important and integral benefit of participating in Electric Football is the collective socializing aspect of the game, when that communal avenue is not open, then Solitaire EFL is certainly a superb alternative. Just ask all the Solitairers playing the game solo today! ■





your opponent can actually count. Trying to take advantage of an opponent is a recurring theme in our 'secrets.'"

With tongue firmly in cheek, four-time Miggle EFL Super Bowl champion Ron Bell of Violet, LA; says: I use the most expendable guy on



One of the country's best-known and well-liked EFL coaches, **Mike Pratt of Hollidaysburg, PA**, is an expert on defending against the kick-off runback. He points out: "Now, let's look at the other side of the ball—defending against long kick-off returns:



Most importantly, stay in your lanes. Have the front line wedge busters run straight into the surge. Second, have the two most outside players run quickly down the field and curl slightly inwards to prevent wide returns. Last, use levels or layers on your coverage formation—like seven players on level one, including your outside gunners. Use three or four

players spaced appropriately on level two. They are to reinforce the wedge busters and also cover for the outside gunners on level one. If only three players are used on level two, utilize one lone deep back to be aimed at the coverage's potential weak spot."

To wrap up this first edition of **Training Circuit:** the Kick-Off, we go back to our Miggle EFL webmaster, Mike Guttman, who contests that it is every coach's worst nightmare to have a kick-off returned for a touchdown.

"To prevent TD run-backs from happening," notes Mike, "most coaches will have players set up to try to prevent long kick-offs. In doing this plan, they will have as many as four figures placed to 'spin' in various locations on the field. Others will try to do both of the above mentioned. Of course, all these decisions depend upon the rules set up by the league or tournament you are playing in and in some cases your own solitaire rules."

PLUGGED IN! would like to thank all of the coaches, both these who were included in this article and those for whom we did not have room. All of your ideas, strategies and recommendations were superlative, and we only wish we had more space to publish all of them.




