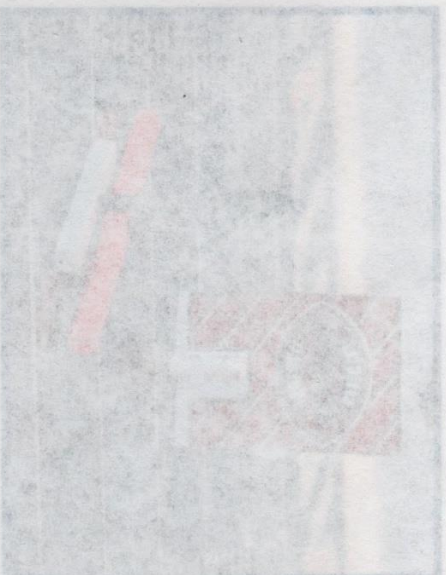

What Is The NHFL?

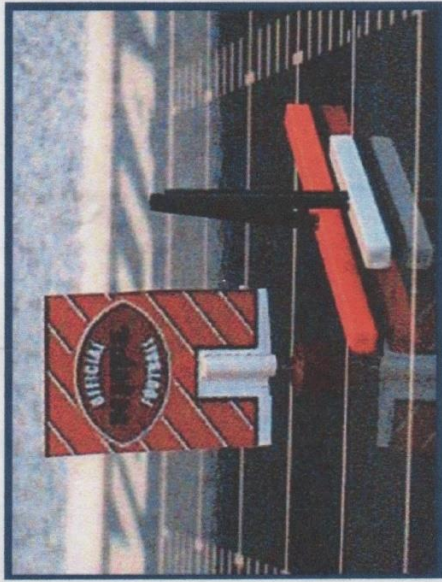
The NHFL is a BuzzBall/Electric Football league that has been established to provide a format for bringing coaches from across the country together under a common set of rules and equipment. It is also unique, in that each coach is responsible for creating and designing their own original team. The NHFL is also the first league to implement the "ATTAC Passing System", a new form of passing that incorporates the tradition of the Triple Threat Quarterback, and the defensive options of Pass Simulation. Last but certainly not least, there's the quest for "The Ring" (photo shown below). Tom Johnson of the Capital Region is the 2005 Champion. Who will be the next coach to wear a National Championship Ring? Could it be you? We look forward to welcoming new coaches who are interested in becoming part of the NHFL family.

The NHFL ATTAC Passing Kit

A.T.T.A.C. Passing System

The ATTAC (Announce Target Throw And Catch) Passing System is the only form of passing allowed in the NHFL. This system incorporates the tradition and skill of the TTQB Pass, in conjunction with the strategy of Pass Simulation/Emulation (or stick passing). While hitting the target with a TTQB pass requires a little bit of practice, mastering the strategy of where to place the target in game situations will require considerably more time. Not only do you have to consider a passing lane, but where the defense is and how your receiver will run towards the ball. 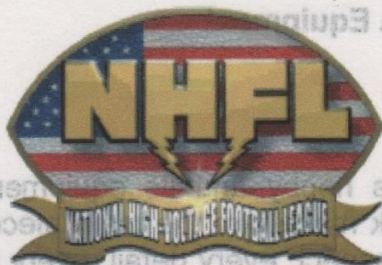
Franchise Information

The NHFL has been created to allow coaches from all over the country to participate in the game we all love, using a one set of rules free from bias to any particular region of the country. The league is structured in regions to eliminate excessive travel for coaches during the regular season, playing games against coaches within their own region. At the end of the season, the teams with the best records will be invited to compete in a National Championship Playoff Tournament. Coaches are required to design their own unique team (names, uniforms, etc.) and have their squads in both home and away uniforms. The cost to participate in the 2005 and 2006 Championship Seasons was \$50 for returning coaches, and \$75 for rookie coaches (\$25 One-Time Franchise Fee and \$50 League Fee for the season). League fees pay for awards, year end banquet and tournament venue, web hosting, and equipment unique to the NHFL, and more. NHFL FRANCHISE INFORMATION - HOW TO GET ONE

The NHFL has been created to allow coaches from all over the country to participate in the game we all love, using a one set of rules free from bias to any particular region of the country. NHFL - FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The National High-Voltage Football League is a new league, with new rules, and a new vision. It stands to reason with so much new that there would be a number of questions raised as people became familiar with the format. The following is a number of frequently asked questions along with answers that will hopefully help you in your understanding of what the NHFL is all about, and how to become a part of it.

Q - Who can join the NHFL?

A - The league is open to ALL for application. All accepted applicants would have agreed to follow the format guidelines.

Q - Can I use NFL, NCAA, USFL, WFL, etc., teams for this league?

A - No need to worry about representing ANY NFL, College, or other existing franchises because NONE are allowed. You must create your own team, team colors, uniforms, etc., to be submitted to the league for approval. We want this entire league experience to be unique for and to its participants. Not just another NFL, college replica league.

NHFL RULES & EQUIPMENT OVERVIEW

In order to craft an unbiased set of rules, we needed coaches that have played the game under different formats. The equipment and rules were dissected piece-by-piece and voted on by committee. In order for a rule to be adopted, three of four committee members had to agree on the rule being voted on. In most cases, the rules contained in the Rule Book were voted in unanimously with a very few exceptions. If a rule was initially split 2-2, the committee took a step back and rehashed every possible scenario for that rule, including hundreds of on-board testing repetitions. The committee then came together and hammered out a final version of the rule. Without exception, every rule created as a result of this process was voted in unanimously! There were times when coming up with a final rule took weeks to come to the final conclusion. For example, the committee spent a total of nine (9) hours on the topic of bases alone that stretched out over three (3) weeks of weekly meetings. Great care was taken to craft a clear and concise set of rules that provide a challenging and competitive game and promote sportsmanship, fellowship, and fair play.
