## INTRODUCTION

Soon after establishing Miggle Toys, President Michael Landsman acquired out of bankruptcy what was left of Tudor Games. Michael had previously been the president of Superior Toys, owners of the Tudor Games brand before he was ousted in 1990. He made this purchase in December of 1991.

It took him until the fall of 1993 to fully get Tudor Games and electric football reintroduced into the toy and game market and they were able to “Set up Shop” in the official Super Bowl Press Room prior to Super Bowl XXVIII held in Atlanta, Georgia between the Dallas Cowboys and Buffalo Bills.

Sometime in 1994 the first Tudor Super Bowl of Electric Football was announced. In a contest open to the hundreds of thousands of Electric Football players around America, the competition challenged Electric Football fans to set up their ultimate offensive play and ideal defensive adjustment and then send videotapes of their creations to Miggle Toys. A panel of judges selected the four best entries and brought the winners to Chicago to play for the Tudor Super Bowl of Electric Football Trophy.

The response to this event was overwhelming. As Miggle Toys received hundreds of videotapes and the national media covered the game and its loyal followers.

This booklet is a compilation of the results of this tournament and convention taken from the accounts published in “*Plugged In!*” Miggle’s *Official Newsletter of Electric Football* and “*The Tweak*” - *The Official Magazine of the MFCA (Miniature Football Coaches Association)*.
